### Men who trafficked fentanyl out of Millennium Hotel sentenced

Both men who admitted trafficking

Both men who admitted trafficking fentanyl out of a room at Downtown's Millennium Hotel have been sentenced. On Wednesday, Hamilton County Common Pleas Judge Chris Wagner sentenced Keyonta Hicks, 33, to four years in prison, a term that had been agreed upon as part of his guilty plea. Late last month, a man related to Hicks, 28-year-old Keron Hicks, also was sentenced to an exercation for the sentence of the se

was sentenced to an agreed-upon four years in prison

During a November 2019 raid of their hotel room, police found more than 360 grams of fentanyl, officials said. The drug had been prepared for sale, court

documents say.

Police also found items including digital scales, a duffel bag with about \$2,700 in cash and "a large amount of jewelry," the documents say.

The street value of the fentanyl found in the hotel room was estimated to be more than \$500,000. An extremely mount of the synthetic opioid can be lethal.

Keron and Keyonta Hicks pleaded

guilty in September to drug trafficking charges. Court documents list the same East Price Hill address for both.

## Police: Beaten woman woke up at home with attacker still there

She woke up to a pillow covered in blood and an aching head, police said. She didn't remember how she got home. Lamar Flagg was in her apartment

and denied harming her, according to investigators. But surveillance video a different story, according to

court documents.
Flagg, 36, of Roselawn, was arrested this week after police said he knocked out the woman, then drove her home in her own car. He is charged with felonious assault and abduction.

The documents state Flagg and the victim were in the parking lot of a West-

wood convenience store Dec. 6 when they began arguing. "(Flagg) appears to punch the victim, causing her to fall down onto the pavement and then she stops moving," police said after review-ing some surveillance footage. "(Flagg) then dragged the victim to the side of

her vehicle, opened the rear door, and loaded her into the backseat."

Flagg drove to her apartment nearby, police said. "The victim stated when she woke up many hours later when she woke up many hours later, there was blood all over her pillow," investigators said. "She could not remember how she said. She could not remember now she got home." She told police Flagg was inside her apartment and said he didn't harm her. Officers reported that the woman eventually went to an emergency room due to pain and was diagnosed with a based injury.

Flagg was arrested Monday. He was being held at the Hamilton County Justice Center on a \$75,000 bond.

## Cincinnati customs finds meth in tortilla press from Mexico

U.S. Customs and Border Protection says its officers in Cincinnati seized a

wooden tortilla press from Mexico after finding methamphetamine hidden in it. Officers discovered the white, pow-dery stimulant Jan. 1 when their drugdery stimulant Jan. I when their drug-sniffing dog named Bruno alerted to the press in a shipment of handicrafts bound for a home in Houston, customs officials said in a news release. The release said the press and the methamphetamine inside it together

methamphetamine inside it together weighed 26 pounds.

The release said overdose deaths from methamphetamine and cocaine have been increasing at an alarming pace since 2009. Provisional data by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention said 2020 overdose death rates from stimulants have increased by 18% over 2019, the release said.


### Kroger store in Delhi Twp. cleared after bomb threat
