I have friends who live on Clay St. in Montville, Ohio 44064I am concerned over the possible approval of this new High Voltage Electric line through our 100% Residential neighborhood.

This should not be approved due to the amount of children in the area that will be standing directly under this line EVERYDAY! This threat to their well-being and their futures is a serious concern for all Clay Street residents and their families and friends who visit.

This action will cause total decimation of the countryside in our area. This is absolutely unnecessary and an alternate route should be considered. Clay Street is a narrow residential street. It will be a severe hindrance when these lines need maintenance.
