On May 10, 2007, Aqua Ohio, Inc., ("Aqua") filed the above-captioned case seeking to amend parts of its Tariff to change from bi-monthly billing cycle to a monthly billing cycle.

Now comes Aqua seeking to file the additional documents in support of its application:

- 1. Proposed Revised Section 6, Third Revised Sheet 1 replacing Second Revised Sheet 1, attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Exhibit 1.
- 2. Proposed Revised Section 6, Fourth Revised Sheet 2 replacing Third Revised Sheet 2, attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Exhibit 2.
- 3. Proposed revised Subject Index Pages, attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Exhibit 3.
- 4. A revised Customer Notice to correct a grammatical oversight, attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Exhibit 4.
- 5. A typical bill comparison demonstrating the revenue neutrality of the proposed conversion from a bi-monthly billing period to a monthly billing period, attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Exhibit 5.

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The purpose of this additional documentation is to further amend and revise all references in the current Tariff to a bi-monthly billing cycle to a monthly billing cycle so that the Tariff is consistent and accurate. Tariff Section 6, Sheet 1, paragraph 3 has also been revised to clarify that all classes of customers are to be billed on a monthly billing cycle and must pay within 15 days or such bills will be delinquent. In addition, Tariff Section 6, Sheet 1, paragraph 3 disconnection for delinquency language in the last sentence has been revised to make the language consistent with the Masury Tariff disconnection language found in Section 5, Sheet 3, paragraph 10(C) of Masury's tariff and to also make it consistent with current Ohio Administrative Code Section 4901:1-15-27(B)(3) applicable to disconnections for delinquent water bills.

Tariff Section 6, Sheet 1, Paragraph 7 has also been revised to clarify that all classes of customers will be rendered monthly water bills in arrears with the exception of bills for private fire protection which are rendered annually in advance. This additional language regarding billing for private fire protection service has been added to clarify the tariff to ensure that it is consistent with company policy which is appropriate given the annual billing cycle for private fire protection service.

Aqua is also including a typical bill comparison to demonstrate that the conversion from a bi-monthly billing period to a monthly billing period will not result in a rate increase for the customer and will not result in increased revenue for Aqua.

Therefore, Aqua respectfully requests the Commission to permit the filing of the proposed tariff sheets along the proposed tariff sheets in the original filing made on May 10, 2007, to become effective on the date, subsequent to filing, to be shown on the proposed tariff

sheets which will be filed with the Commission, modified by any further revisions that have become effective prior to the effective date of the proposed schedule sheets.



#### BILLS AND PAYMENTS FOR SERVICE

- 1. A customer is liable for the payment for all water and service supplied to his premises.
- All bills for charges due to the Company shall be paid to the Company's office, or to any 2. duly authorized agent of the Company.
- Bills will be mailed or delivered to the customer at the address of the premises served. 3. unless the customer shall, in writing, request that they shall be sent to some other address specified by him, but failure to receive a bill shall not relieve the customer from obligation to pay the same when due. Bills for water service become delinquent not less than fifteen (15) days after the billing date thereof. Water service may be shut off not less than fourteen (14) days after the Company mails a disconnection notice informing the customer of the delinquent bill.
- 4. The late payment fee of 5% is based on current charges only, is not compounded on future delinquencies, and is not imposed during any billing period in which payments exceed the customer's current charges. The late payment fee will not be charged if mailed on or before the past due date indicated on the bill. The Post Office date stamped by the sending office will determine the mailing date of the customer's payment. The envelope in which such payment has been mailed may be preserved by the Company, and where payment is made after the past due date, the Company may credit the amount enclosed to the customer's account and add the late payment fee.
- 5. The past due date of a customer bill will be automatically extended to include the first full business day following a Saturday, Sunday or a legal holiday.
- In case a customer shall file written objection to any bill on or prior to the due date of the 6. bill, the Company will accept payment of the bill within seven (7) calendar days after the customer has been notified of the results of the Company's investigation made in response to the complaint.
- 7. Bills for water service (except final bills on discontinuance of service) will be rendered monthly in arrears, and in the case of metered service, shall show the quantity of water used as the billing basis for the period for which the bill is rendered. Bills for private fire protection service shall be rendered in advance.

### BILLS AND PAYMENTS FOR SERVICE (Concluded)

- 8. A customer desiring water service to be discontinued temporarily to a premises used or occupied for only part of the year shall so notify the Company. Such premises, save and except public parks, public playgrounds, educational buildings and facilities and lots or parcels of land being furnished water service solely for lawn sprinkling or other irrigation purposes, shall however, remain subject to continuous year-round charges at regular meter rates and customer charges.
- 9. Bills rendered upon termination of water service much be paid within fifteen (15) days from the date rendered. When not so paid, such bill shall be increased by the actual out-of-pocket cost of collection.
- 10. Should the Company desire to change the billing cycle for any customer or group of customers, it shall give notice of such change to the affected customers at least thirty (30) days in advance of such change, after receiving necessary approval from the Commission.
- 11. A dishonored check charge, set forth in the Schedule of Rates section of this tariff (Section 2, Sheet No. 4, Schedule D), shall be assessed with each such occurrence and shall be due and payable immediately.

### Proposed Notice to Masury Customers of Change in Tariff

On \_\_\_\_, 2007, in case No. 07-\_\_\_\_-WW-ATA, the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio approved a request by Aqua Ohio, Inc., to make changes to the rate pages of the Masury Division P.U.C.O. Tariff No. 4. The approval changes the billing cycle from bi-monthly to monthly, changes the measurement of water usage from 100 cubic feet to 10 cubic feet and permits the calculation of the water usage in gallons as well as cubic feet. You will see these changes reflected on your next water bill. These changes to the tariff do not have any impact on the rates charged by Aqua Ohio to the customers of the Masury Division or on typical water bill.
