PAUSCH called as a witness on behalf of the Complainant, 13 being first duly sworn, testified as follows: 1.4 DIRECT EXAMINATION 1.5 By Mr. Etter: 16 1.7 Q. Would you state your name, please. 1.8 Α. Linda L. Pausch, P-A-U-S-C-H. 1.9 0. And what is your position with the Office of the Ohio Consumers' Counsel? 20 21 Α. I am a Senior Telecom Compliance Analyst. And do you have before you today the 22 testimony that was filed August 9 in this proceeding? 23 I have my prefiled testimony with 24 Α. Yes.

- Q. Okay. And do you have any other documents there with you this morning?
- A. Yes. I need to supplement the testimony that was filed on August 7 -- August 9, sorry.
- Q. Okay. And why do you believe that you need to supplement your testimony?
- A. On Monday, August 13, we held a -- OCC held a deposition with Scott Wilson from UMCC and we learned information during that deposition and we also received discovery responses from Mr. Wilson on Monday as well.
- Q. And what additional information are you presenting from the discovery responses?
- A. I would like to supplement my testimony looking at page 6, line 12. During the deposition, Mr. Wilson stated that UMCC continued to bill customers through May of 2007. My initial testimony indicated that at that time we believed that he billed -- that UMCC billed customers through April of 2007, and we learned at that deposition he billed customers through May of 2007.
- Q. And, now, turning to the discovery what additional information are you presenting from the

discovery responses?

A. From the discovery Mr. Wilson admitted that UMCC was not certified to provide long distance service here in Ohio. He also mentioned that UMCC did not include OCC nor PUCO information on the consumer invoices that were sent to consumers between December, 2006, and May, 2007. And Mr. Wilson also admitted in the discovery that Ohio consumers were not notified that UMCC would be their long distance carrier after the conversion of assets between Buzz and UMCC.

And, finally, Mr. Wilson admitted that UMCC did bill one or more Ohio consumers for long distance services beginning December 1 through -- beginning December 1, 2006, through May of 2007.

- Q. And along with those discovery responses do you recall that OCC had requested records from UMCC?
 - A. Yes, we did.
- Q. And did Mr. Wilson -- did UMCC provide those records that OCC had requested in those discovery responses?
- A. No, he has not. However, he did indicate those records would be forthcoming within the next

. | two weeks.

- Q. And where did he say that those records are currently housed?
- A. He said that the records were in an office space in Veedersburg, Indiana, and that those records are in boxes and file cabinets in his office space.

ATTORNEY EXAMINER LYNN: Ms. Pausch, for the record would you spell the name of that city?

- Q. And do you have any concerns regarding the preservation of those records?
- A. Yes, we do. First of all, we have concerns that the data may not be in a secure location. He mentioned that it's in an office space in Veedersburg, Indiana, where there is no one watching over these records. That led us to believe that the records are just sitting there. He further mentioned that he is behind on the rent at that

office space and let us know he has to be out of that office space by October -- sorry, by August 31 which also led us to believe that time is of the essence and the chance those records may disappear after August 31, so we do have concerns that that data is not in a secured place.

Initially, Mr. Wilson stated that he is in the process of undoing the transaction between Buzz Telecom and UMCC and that some of the data may have already been transferred back to Buzz Telecom. So we are very concerned that the data may just disappear on us, and we would ask the Commission that -- that the Commission require UMCC and Buzz Telecom to preserve the data for inspection by OCC and PUCO Staff.

- Q. And taking a look at your prefiled testimony, if I ask you the same questions today, would you respond in the same way as you've supplemented them here today?
 - A. Yes, I would.

MR. ETTER: That's all I have for Ms. Pausch and I tender the witness for cross-examination, your Honor.

ATTORNEY EXAMINER LYNN: All right. I

accept there is no one here to do a cross-examination so thank you for providing -- thank you for providing that up, but as I indicated here earlier, there is no one to represent the UMCC at all.
