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5. An application which is approved by the Company shall become a binding contract between the Applicant and the Company. Such a contract obligates the Applicant to pay charges imposed by the Company in accordance with these Regulations, to obey all the terms and provisions of these Regulations, to obey all other lawful and applicable rules, regulations and directives set forth by federal, state or local governments.
6. All customers will be billed monthly in arrears. All customers shall be billed by and shall make payment to Village of Byesville, Mayor Donald J. Gadd, Receiver for Utility Operators Corporation. All bills for sewer service shall be due and payable to the Company within fifteen (15) days of the billing date as stated on the bill. All bills not paid within this time shall be considered delinquent and subject to a one time late payment fee of 5%. The late payment fee shall be based on current charges only, shall not be compounded on future delinquencies, and not be imposed during any billing period in which payments made exceed the customer's current charges.
7. No customer or other person shall discharge into the sewage system any material that will be harmful to the system or treatment process or will plug or obstruct the sewers. Such materials include, but are not limited to oils, grease, acids, caustics, poisons or toxic, flammable or bulky materials, liquids or vapors. The discharge of storm water or groundwater into the sewage system is prohibited. Failure of any customer to eliminate any prohibited discharge from his property, regardless of its cause, shall be cause for the Company to take such action as it deems necessary to protect the sewage system and the other customers. Such action may include immediate disconnection of the customer's property from the system.

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
