And what might this be? As the complaints in this section show, <u>ILD Teleservices</u> is the name that appears next to mysterious charges on consumer phone bills. That's because ILD, among other things, is a "billing clearinghouse" for companies that bill for their services by placing charges on local phone bills.

Since its inception, this has been an area that has been open to abuse. There have been thousands of complaints about billing clearinghouses passing on phony and inflated charges for everything from collect calls to psychic readings, a practice known in the industry as "cramming."

ILD's Web site provides no clue to consumers as to how they might dispute inaccurate charges.... However, it is one of seven clearinghouses that belong to something called CERB, the Coalition to Ensure Responsible Billing, CERB members subscribe to "stringent, pro-consumer policies for ensuring that only legitimate charges appear on consumers? bills."

One of CERB's standards is "Consumer Satisfaction." This section states:

quickly discuss problems. Members are committed to monitoring consumer satisfaction particularly with regard to any disputes or inquiries that may arise. Members will provide quick and thorough responses. Members shall provide on request:

- The name, address, phone number and fax number of the service provider.
- · The nature of any charge.
- The method of authorization.
- Information as to how a consumer may cancel a service or product.

CERB members are also supposed to aid in solving dispute and are required to:

- Provide a toll free customer service number.
- Provide dedicated staff to respond to consumer inquiries.
- Provide a full and timely investigation of any dispute.
- Initiate a credit or respond to the consumer within 30 days of the consumer's dispute.

Thus, any consumer whose local telephone bill includes an unauthorized charge from ILD should immediately call the toll-free number next to the charge to find out what the charge is for. If the charge is unauthorized, the consumer should politely insist that the ILD representative investigate further and report back in 30 days.

If ILD fails to do so, consumers should file a complete report using the Consumer Affairs. Com complaint form, with copies to the Federal Trade Commission and their state Public Utilities Commission.

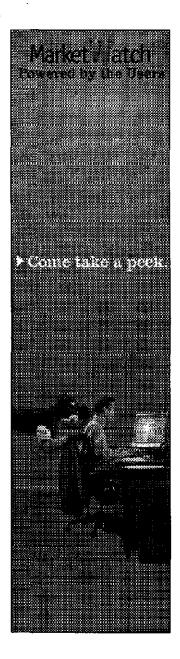
Recent Complaints

We responded no each time. We then asked to be taken off the calling list, in no uncertain terms. Shortly after is when we received this charge.

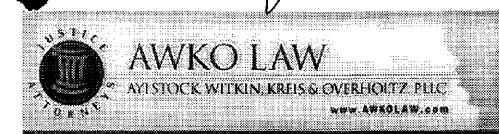

THE "CRAMMING" EFFECT

Have you ever been charged for something on your phone or credit card bill that you didn't purchase? Have you ever been victimized by charges with an "ILD" classification and been unable to have them reversed? If you answered "yes" to either of these questions, then you might have been a victim of "cramming."

Cramming is a type of consumer fraud typically associated with telephone services, in which fraudulent charges or overcharges are applied to a consumer's account. In addition to being billed directly by your telephone provider for services rendered, you may also be billed on behalf of other companies, oftentimes in a deceitful or fraudulent manner. Cramming tactics are not unlike email or web spamming, and may in fact be used in conjunction with one another.

ILD Teleservices and Other "Billing Clearinghouses"

ILD Teleservices is one of several billing clearinghouses that serve as an intermediary for companies that use local telephone companies to bill consumers for their services. Billing clearinghouses are legitimate businesses that are not always manipulated, though they provide the perfect cover for crammers. Charges through billing clearinghouses are disguised with the name of the clearinghouse as opposed to the source of the charge. This creates an additional hurdle that consumers must deal with when contesting a charge. It can take a great deal of time to simply determine what it is that you are being charged for, before determining whether or not it is fraudulent. This weakness affords crammers protection and anonymity, making it easier for them to continue to prey on innocent consumers.

Cramming - What to Watch out for

The nature of cramming is such that it is often difficult to realize you've been victimized until it's too late. Contesting fraudulent charges can be time consuming and fruitless. Oftentimes, cramming is done in such a subtle manner that it goes unnoticed. Many consumers trust the process to such an extent that they simply pay their bills without checking individual charges. Crammers prey on such consumer trust.

There are several things that may indicate cramming fraud:

- 1. Spam Email: Never open spam email. Talk with your ISP about spam protection for your email account. If you are getting an increased number of spam emails, alert your ISP.
- 2. Junk Mail: Pay attention to the fine print in junk snall mail. Oftentimes, "negative options" require you to contact a vendor to prevent service charges. Essentially, ignoring the vendor is considered a service agreement.
- 3. Know who You're Talking to: Crammers often pretend to be representatives from your phone company. They may ask you basic yes/no questions about your service, and record your "yes" responses. These can be doctored to show your consent for fraudulent services rendered.

It is incredibly important that you as a consumer ensure that all charges on your phone or credit bill can be accounted for.

Failure to do so may result in you being victimized by crammers.

Victimized by Cramming? What can you do?

If you have been a victim of cramming, you may be entitled to receive compensation for your losses. The difficulty of dealing with crammers is that they filter their fraud through third party venders like ILD Teleservices, making it difficult for consumers to get fraudulent charges reversed. Oftentimes, third party venders who have charged you via your telephone service provider can demonstrate proof of purchase on your behalf, in the form of a web receipt or transaction record. This proof of purchase, like the crammed charges, is fraudulent and difficult to contest. This is where we come in.
