AMENDED JOINT APPLICATION TO TRANSFER A CERTIFICATE TO FIRSTENERGY GENERATION CORP.

This Amended Joint Application is filed in order to make a correction to the parties. On December 15, 2003, the Ohio Power Siting Board ("Board") approved a transfer of the Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need ("Certificate") issued by the Board on May 21, 2001 from Fremont Energy Center LLC ("Fremont") to Calpine Corporation ("Calpine"). Fremont had been owned indirectly by Calpine but by virtue of a merger, Calpine became the surviving corporation. Thus the Joint Applicants are Calpine, the current holder of the Certificate as corrected, modified or amended by the Entry Nunc Pro Tunc of June 18, 2001, and the Entries dated December 15, 2004 and January 10, 2005 in this proceeding, and FirstEnergy Generation Corp. ("FirstEnergy"), the proposed transferee (together, "Joint Applicants").

In its May 21, 2001 Opinion, Order and Certificate the Board approved the construction of a 704¹ megawatt electric combined-cycle, natural gas generating facility in Fremont, Sandusky County, Ohio. The Fremont facility is now approximately 70% complete.

¹ The Opinion, Order and Certificate notes, "The maximum net-plant winter output will be 760 MWs and the maximum summer output will be 680 MWs." at 2.

Joint Applicants have entered into an agreement whereby all the assets of this project, including the Certificate, permits and other authorizations pertaining to the Fremont facility, will be transferred to FirstEnergy. FirstEnergy plans to continue construction of the Fremont facility in accordance with the Certificate issued by the Board on May 21, 2001 and June 18, 2001, respectively. It pledges to comply with the terms, conditions and modifications contained in the Certificate.

Ohio Revised Code Section ("R.C.") 4906.04 applies to a change in ownership of the Certificate where a new third-party entity proposes to acquire the certificate and provides that the Board determine whether a certificate should be transferred to the new third-party entity and, if so, to approve the transfer.

WHEREFORE, Joint Applicants respectfully request that, pursuant to R.C. 4906.04, the Board find that it should approve the transfer of the Certificate to FirstEnergy.
