SECTION 5 - EXCHANGE ACCESS SERVICE (Cont'd)

5.1 <u>General</u>

- 5.1.1 Exchange Access Service provides a Customer with a telephonic connection to, and a unique telephone number address on the public switched telecommunications network. Each Exchange Access Service enables users to:
 - (A) receive calls from other stations on the public switched telecommunications network;
 - (B) access other services offered by the Company as set forth in this tariff;
 - (C) access certain interstate and international calling services provided by the Company;
 - (D) access (at no additional charge) the Company's operators and business office for service related assistance;
 - (E) access (at no additional charge) emergency services by dialing 0- or 9-1-1; and
 - (F) access services provided by other common carriers that purchase the Company's Switched Access services as provided under the Company's Federal and State tariffs, or that maintain other types of traffic exchange arrangements with the Company.

Each Exchange Access Service is available on a "Full" service basis, whereby service is delivered to a demarcation/connection block at the Customer's premises.

The following Exchange Access Services are offered:

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SECTION 5 - EXCHANGE ACCESS SERVICE (Cont'd)

5.2 Basic Line Service

Basic Line Service provides a Business and Residential Customer with a single, voice-grade telephonic communications channel that can be used to place or receive one call at a time. Basic Lines are provided for connection of Customer-provided single station sets or facsimile machines to the public switched telecommunications network. Each Basic Line may be configured into a hunt group with other Company-provided Basic Lines. Each Basic Line contains the standard features listed below. Optional features are set forth in Section 10.5 of the tariff

6.1 Directory Listings

For each Customer of Company-provided Exchange Access Service(s), the Company shall arrange for the listing of the Customer's main billing telephone number² in the directory(ies) published by the dominant Local Exchange Carrier in the area at no additional charge.

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 $^{^2}$ For Customers with multiple premises served by the Company, the Company will arrange for a listing of the main billing telephone number at each premise.

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SECTION 6 - EXCHANGE ACCESS OPTIONAL FEATURES (Cont'd)

6.2 Main Number Retention

6.2.1 Description

Main Number Retention is an optional feature by which a new Customer, who was formally a customer of another certificated local exchange carrier at the same premises location, may retain its main telephone numbers and main fax numbers for use with the Company-provided Exchange Access Services. Main Number Retention service is only available in areas where the Company maintains some form of number retention arrangement with the Customer's former local exchange carrier.

Monthly recurring and non-recurring charges apply per retained number. Rates for retained numbers may vary from area to area.

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SECTION 8 - LOCAL CALLING SERVICE (Cont'd)

8.1 <u>Description</u>

Local Calling Service provides a Customer with the ability to originate calls from a Companyprovided access line to all other stations on the public switched telephone network⁴ bearing the designation of any central office exchanges, areas, and zones included in the Customer's local calling area.

8.1.1 Basic Local Exchange Service

This calling service allows the Customer unlimited access to all other stations on the public switched telephone network within the Customer's Basic Local Calling Area. All calls to destinations outside the Basic Local Calling Area but within the same state and LATA will be charged the IntraLATA rates as specified in Section 9.3 following.

8.1.2 Expanded Local Exchange Service

This calling service allows the Customer limited access to all other stations on the public switched telephone network within the Customer's Basic Local Calling Area. Additional calls to the Basic Local Calling Area will be charged as specified in Section 8.2.1(A) following. All calls to the Expanded Local Calling Area² will be charged a per call setup and per minute access charge as specified in Section 8.2.1(B) following. All calls to destinations outside the Expanded Local Calling Area but within the same state and LATA will be charged the IntraLATA rates as specified in Section 9.3 following.

9.1 <u>Description</u>

IntraLATA calling service provides a Customer with the ability to originate calls from a Company-provided access line to all other stations on the public switched telephone network⁵ bearing the designation of any central office exchanges, areas, and zones outside of the Customer's Basic Calling Area but within the same state and LATA.

9.2 <u>Time Periods</u>

Day, Evening and Night/Weekend rate periods are shown below. On holidays, Evening rates will apply unless a lower rate will normally apply.

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SECTION 10 - MISCELLANEOUS SERVICES

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10.1 <u>Traditional Operator Services</u>

10.1.1 Description

Operator Handled Calling Services are provided to Customers and Users of Companyprovided Exchange Access Services, and to Customers and Users of exchange access lines.

10.1.2 Definitions

<u>Person-Person</u>: Calls completed with the assistance of a Company operator to a particular person, station, department, or PBX extension specified by the calling party. Charges may be billed to the Customer's commercial credit card and/or LEC calling card, calling station, called station, or a designated third-party station. Calls may be dialed with or without the assistance of a Company operator.

<u>Station-to-Station:</u> Refers to calls other than person-to-person calls billed to either the end user's commercial credit card and/or nonproprietary calling card. Calls may be dialed with or without the assistance of a Company operator. Collect calls to coin telephones and transfers of charges to third telephones which are coin telephones will not be accepted.

<u>Operator Dialed Charge:</u> The end user places the call without dialing the destination number, although the capability to do it himself exists. The end user will dial "0" for local calls and "00" for long distance calls and then request the operator to dial the called station.

<u>Billed to Non-Proprietary Calling Card:</u> Refers to calls that are dialed by the Customer in accordance with standard dialing instructions and billed to a non-proprietary calling card issued by another carrier.

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10.1 <u>Traditional Operator Services</u> (Cont'd)

10.1.3 <u>Rates</u>

Local exchange and IntraLATA calls may be placed on an Operator Assisted basis. Usage charges for Operator Assisted calls are the same as those set forth in Sections 8 and 9, preceding. For Operator Assisted calls to Busy Line Verification and Interrupt, or Directory Assistance, the surcharges specified in Section 10.2.3 and Section 10.1.3 will apply in addition to any applicable Operator charges.

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10.2 Alternative Operator Services

10.2.1 Description

The following applies to the provision of alternative operator services (AOS) (see also Case No.8-560-TP-COI):

AOS are those services provided by the Company in which the Customer and the User are totally separate entities. The Company contracts with the Customer to provide the AOS; however, the Company does not directly contract with the User to provide the services even though it is the end user who actually pays for the processing of the operator-assisted calls.

10.2.2 AOS Service Parameters

For local operator-assisted calls, the Company shall not charge the billed party more than the local exchange company (LEC) price list rtes for a local operator-assisted call in the same exchange. This requirement includes both the rates for MTS and operator surcharges.

For intraLATA, intrastate calls, the Company, when serving secured facilities, shall not charge the billed party more than the LEC price list rates for an intraLATA, intrastate call. This requirement includes both the rates for MTS and operator surcharges. This requirements is only applicable in those situations were the billed party does not have access to other operator service providers (OSPs) for the call from the secured facility.

10.2.3 Rates

For intraLATA and interLATA, intrastate calls, in conjunction with AOS (see also Case No. 89-563-TP-COI) the following charges will apply:

This rule does not apply to the provision of interrelate, intrastate calls from secured inmate facilities where there is no access to other OSPs.

For intraLATA and interLATA, intrastate calls, each Company's maximum interexchange operator-assisted rates shall be no more than:

\$1.70 for customer-dialed calling card calls;\$2.50 for operator-handled calls; and\$4.80 for person-to-person calls.

This rule does not apply to the provision of intraLATA, intrastate calls from secured inmate facilities where there is no access to other OSPs.

10.3 Limitation Of Liability

The following is applicable to all competitive telecommunication providers that choose to include in their tariffs language which may limit their liability (See also Case No. 85-1406-AU-COI):

Approval of limitation of liability language the PUCO does not constitute a determination by the Commission that the limitation of liability imposed by the company should be upheld in a court of law. Approval by the Commission merely recognizes that since it is a court's responsibility to adjudicates negligence and consequent damage claims, it is also the court's responsibility to determine the validity of the exculpatory clause.

10.4 <u>Termination Liability</u>

The following is applicable to all competitive telecommunication providers that choose to include in their tariffs language which may limit their liability for early termination of a contract or term payment plan:

Commission authorization of the termination liability language pursuant to the 0-day notice procedure is not intended to indicate that the Commission has approved or sanctioned any terms or provisions contained therein. Signatories to such contracts shall be free to pursue whatever legal remedies they may have should a dispute arise.

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10.5 Busy Line Verify and Line Interrupt Service

10.5.1 Description

Upon request of a calling party the Company will verify a busy condition on a called line.

- (A) The operator will determine if the line is clear or in use and report to the calling party.
- (B) The operator will interrupt the call on the called line only if the calling party indicates an emergency and requests interruption.

10.5.2 <u>Regulations</u>

- (A) A charge will apply when:
 - (1) The operator verifies that the line is busy with a call in progress.
 - (2) The operator verifies that the line is available for incoming calls.
 - (3) The operator verifies that the called number is busy with a call in progress and the Customer requests interruption. The operator will then interrupt the call, advising the called party the name of the calling party. One charge will apply for both verification and interruption.

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10.5 Busy Line Verify and Line Interrupt Service (Cont'd)

- 10.5.2 <u>Regulations</u> (Cont'd)
 - (B) No charge will apply:
 - (1) When the calling party advises that the call is to or from an official public emergency agency.
 - (2) Under conditions other than those specified in 10.2.2(A) preceding.
 - (C) Busy Verification and Interrupt Service is furnished where and to the extent that facilities permit.
 - (D) The Customer shall identify and hold the Company harmless against all claims that may arise from either party to the interrupted call or any person.

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SECTION 11 - SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS

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11.1 Special Construction

11.1.1 Basis for Charges

Where the Company furnishes a facility or service for which a rate or charge is not specified in the Company's tariffs, charges will be based on the costs incurred by the Company and may include:

- (A) non-recurring type charges;
- (B) recurring type charges;
- (C) termination liabilities; or
- (D) combinations thereof.
- 11.1.2 Termination Liability

To the extent that there is no other requirement for use by the Company, a termination liability may apply for facilities specially constructed at the request of the Customer.

- (A) The termination liability period is the estimated service life of the facilities provided.
- (B) The amount of the maximum termination liability is equal to the estimated amounts for:

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- 11.1 Special Construction (Cont'd)
 - 11.1.2 <u>Termination Liability</u> (Cont'd)
 - (B) <u>(Cont'd)</u>
 - (1) Cost of installation of the facilities provided including estimated costs for rearrangements of existing facilities and/or construction of new facilities as appropriate, less net salvage. Cost installed includes the cost of:
 - (a) equipment and materials provided or used,
 - (b) engineering, labor and supervision,
 - (c) transportation, and
 - (d) rights-of-way;
 - (2) license preparation, processing, and related fees;
 - (3) tariff preparation, processing, and related fees;
 - (4) cost of removal and restoration, where appropriate; and
 - (5) any other identifiable costs related to the specially constructed or rearranged facilities.
 - (C) The applicable termination liability method for calculating the unpaid balance of a term obligation. The amount of such charge is obtained by multiplying the sum of the amounts determined as set forth in Section 11.1.2(B) preceding by a factor related to the unexpired period of liability and the discount rate for return and contingencies. The amount determined in section 11.1.2(B) preceding shall be adjusted to reflect the redetermined estimate net salvage, including any reuse of the facilities provided. This product is adjusted to reflect applicable taxes.

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11.2 Individual Case Basis (ICB) Arrangements

Arrangements will be developed on a case-by-case basis in response to a bona fide request from a Customer or prospective Customer to develop a competitive bid for a service offered under this tariff. Rates quoted in response to such competitive requests may be different than those specified for such services in this tariff. ICB rates will be offered to the Customer in writing and on a nondiscriminatory basis. Such ICBs will be filed with and approved by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio under the guidelines of Case No. 95-845-TP-COI.

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11.3 <u>Temporary Promotional Programs</u>

The Company may establish temporary promotional programs wherein it may waive or reduce non-recurring or recurring charges, to introduce present or potential Customers to a service not previously received by the Customers. The only limitation upon temporary promotions shall be that the waiver of any charges other than a non-recurring charge shall be limited to 90 calendar days on a per customer basis.

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SECTION 12 - INTEREXCHANGE SERVICE
