On Monday, July 28, 2008 the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio's (PUCO) staff representative held a local public hearing in Youngstown, Ohio on Dominion East Ohio's application to increase distribution rates. At that hearing it was indicated the public could provide written comments regarding this case. I offer the following comments:

- 1. The PUCO has failed to present adequate information (detailed cost analysis on the cost of service and a comparison of the facts and figures) to the public regarding the need for this increase and the staff's position (see item #2 below). The PUCO has also failed to recognize the docket information (last count 229 documents) is substantial and confusing to the public.
- 2. This case and the distribution rate does not appear to address the commercial and industrial users. It is not clear what impact these users will have on Dominions revenue stream and the current need for a distribution rate increase. It is also not clear if the commercial and industrial customers will subject to some future distribution rate case. The PUCO's ruling should again delineate a need for this rate increase considering there are other classes of users and revenue sources.
- 3. The various cost components on the distribution of gas provides Dominion East Ohio the opportunity to amass several revenue sources in which they could over collect if such an increase is granted.
- 4. There is no information on cost controls involving Dominion's distribution rate adjustment. What analysis is done to assure the public that Dominion East Ohio does not over collect on it's distribution rate revenue.

This is to certify that the images appearing are an accurate and complete reproduction of a case file document delivered in the regular course of pusiness.

- 5. The PUCO Commission should offer more hearings in the evenings in facilities that can accommodate the public.
- 6. The PUCO Commissioners should be present at the local hearings to address the public on this rate increase.

This case is far reaching and very voluminous. More effort is needed by the PUCO Commissioners to adequately educate and provide an analysis to the public on why or if this rate request is needed. More time should be given to the public to address this rate request and any ruling should be delayed until such time the PUCO addresses all issues, comments and requests for information.

Finally, it is hoped that the PUCO Commissioners do not simply grant their staff or Dominion's position without fully exploring the cost as pointed out above and it's impact to the public.

Amended Substitute Senate Bill 221 set ambitious, but realizable targets for renewable energy generation by the Ohio electricity utilities. Any implementation to meet those targets is going to require a large amount of generation using photovoltaic apparatus.

As the Public Utilities Commission prepares rules for implementing SB221, I respectfully request that the rules be written to require a large amount of photovoltaic generation at the earliest time possible. To whom it may concern:

I am writing in regard to the proposed rate increase by Dominion East Ohio Gas Company. I currently have a contract with another supplier, but Dominion is my delivery agent.

I am a sixty-year old, divorced woman who recently purchased a small ranch home so that I could have my 85 year old mother move in with me, as she has mild dementia and can no longer live on her own.

For the past 10 years I lived in a rented condo and my gas bill was never more than \$200 per month. This past year, in February, I received a \$437.00 gas bill. At the end of the season, I had a \$600 plus balance to pay off. I had to made special arrangements with the gas company to pay off the balance. By the way, did I mention that I work 3 jobs: one full time and 2 part time to make ends meet.

I usually stay on the budget plan from October through June, with a brief respite from high payments during the summer months. This year I was unable to do that because of my high balance left over from winter. A house is a major expense and much more expensive than living in a rental unit, even though I was paying utilities there also. Everything is more expensive in your own home. Now that gasoline, food and utilities have gone up—it's getting harder and harder to pay my bills.

I am definitely not in favor of any type of rate hikes. How do you or the utility companies expect us to survive? I've been in this home for only 8 months and already I am worried about losing it due to inflation. I ask you to please re-consider this increase. Please do not put any more burdens on the middle class workers of this nation. We have suffered enough during this current administration and are a dying breed, literally!!


