  Competitiveness Fund (ECF), which is a component of its Electric Security Plan
  (ESP).

#### II. <u>ECF TRACKER DISCUSSION</u>

# 10 Q: PLEASE EXPLAIN DE-OHIO'S PROPOSED ECONOMIC 11 COMPETITIVENESS FUND.

12 A: The ECF is intended to support public and private economic development 13 investments within the DE-Ohio certified territory. Through the ECF, DE-Ohio 14 will provide grants to partially support public green infrastructure projects, such 15 as mass transit and renewable energy. In addition, the ECF will provide grants to 16 support public and private job creation and retention initiatives and respond to 17 requests by business consumers for generation service discounts. The investment 18 will be recovered through an ECF tracker.

### 19 Q: WHY IS DE-OHIO PROPOSING THIS FUND?

A: The fund will enable DE-Ohio to meet the requirements of O.A.C. Chapter
 4901:1-38. The purpose of that chapter is to, among other things, facilitate a
 global economy through the increased job growth and job retention in the State of
 Ohio. The chapter is also intended to promote energy efficiency and acknowledge

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environmental technologies.

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#### PLEASE EXPLAIN HOW THE ECF TRACKER SATISFIES THE 2 **O**: **REOUIREMENTS OF O.A.C. CHAPTER 4901:1-38.** 3

DE-Ohio's proposed ECF will encourage investments in economic development 4 A: 5 initiatives and green infrastructure within the DE-Ohio certified territory. Grants may be awarded to public or private entities for the purpose of attracting new jobs 6 or retaining existing jobs to the DE-Ohio service area. In addition, ECF grants to 7 partially support public green infrastructure will positively impact the 8 9 environment and create greater awareness for renewable energy and energy 10 efficiency.

#### 11 **Q:** WHAT IS THE BENEFIT OF INCLUDING PUBLIC INITIATIVES OR **PROJECTS WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THE ECF?** 12

13 **A**: DE-Ohio acknowledges the important role that public entities (e.g., local 14 governments, chambers of commerce, economic development organizations, 15 public service entities, and educational institutions) play in attracting and retaining 16 jobs and a talented workforce. Most often, public initiatives require a broad base 17 of community support and leverage both public and private investment. In 18 addition, public entities are often better positioned to make investments in green 19 infrastructure, such as mass transit and renewable energy. DE-Ohio believes that 20 allowing both public and private sectors to participate in the ECF will encourage collaboration and increase the effectiveness of economic development within the 21 22 DE-Ohio service area.

# 1HAS GIVEN TO INVESTMENT IN PUBLIC GREEN2INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS RELATIVE TO THE ECF.

3 A: DE-Ohio recognizes the positive impact public green infrastructure projects, such 4 as mass transit and renewable energy, have on the environment. These projects 5 encourage smart growth, attract private investment, and increase public awareness 6 of renewable energy and energy efficiency. To support these projects, DE-Ohio 7 will allocate a total of \$1 million towards mass transit and renewable energy 8 projects during the term of the ESP, provided DE-Ohio receives Renewable 9 Energy Credits (REC's) associated with funded projects. Additional public 10 project grants will be considered throughout the term of the ESP. All ECF grants 11 or contracts, with the exception of the aforementioned \$1 million allocation, are 12 subject to review by the Commission and will be recovered through an 13 unavoidable ECF - Sustainable Community Fund tracker (Rider DR-ECF). DE-14 Ohio will adjust Rider DR-ECF quarterly and shall otherwise make annual filings 15 that will be subject to Commission audit.

# 16 Q: WILL THE ECF PROVIDE THE SOLE MECHANISM FOR CAPITAL

- 17 INVESTMENT RELATIVE TO GREEN INFRASTURE?
- 18 A: No. The ECF grants shall be made when supplemented by other public or private
  19 investments.

### 20 Q: PLEASE EXPLAIN WHETHER THE ECF IS INTENDED TO DIRECTLY

- 21 BENEFIT BUSINESS CONSUMERS.
- A: Business customers will benefit from economic development initiatives that
   attract and retain a talented workforce or improve the quality of the existing

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1		workforce in the region. In addition, business consumers may apply for
2		generation discounts under the ECF. Any such application must be approved by
3		the Commission.
