JOINT NOTICE OF AGREEMENT AS TO IMPLEMENTATION OF PROPOSED TARIFFS

On February 22, 2008, Columbia Gas of Ohio, Inc. ("Columbia") submitted proposed tariff sections to implement the Stipulation filed in the above styled proceeding. The Ohio Gas Marketers Group on May 2, 2008 filed comments accepting the proposed tariff language, but objecting to the planned implementation of the proposed tariff. Chief among the objections was the assignment of interstate pipeline capacity held by Columbia on Panhandle Eastern EFT (field zone to Maumee) for the use of CHOICE customers for the period June 1, 2008 through October 31, 2008 (hereinafter "PH Summer Capacity").

The assignment of the PH Summer Capacity has been worked out between Columbia and the Ohio Gas Marketers Group who have agreed upon the following procedure:

1. Columbia offered to assign to all Choice suppliers PH Summer Capacity based upon the core customer load being served by the Choice supplier using the allocation formula for Panhandle Eastern capacity agreed to for the post November 1, 2008 period.

- 2. The offer was made to all Choice suppliers with core customer loads which would entitle them to Panhandle Eastern capacity under the Stipulation.
- 2. The PH Summer Capacity was offered at maximum tariff rates.
- 3. The revenue from the PH Summer releases are not to be counted against each Choice supplier requirement to accept assignment of the Columbia Transmission Cost contract costs of a minimum of 83%.

In light of the above procedure to implement proposed Tariff Section VII, Second Revised Sheet No. 17, Page 3 of 6, Part 17.3, the Ohio Gas Marketers believe that all the concerns addressed in its May 2, 2008 comments have been adequately addressed and join with Columbia in supporting prompt approval of the February 22, 2008 tariff filing.
