

Favre was then joined by Jets chairman and CEO Woody Johnson and general manager Mike Tannenbaum. During his drawn-out divorce with the Packers, Favre said he had been reluctant to "speak" with Tannenbaum because he was certain the GM would be able to sell him on joining the Jets.

"He's convincing," Favre said, drawing a smile from Tannenbaum. "I know this team had a lot of talent."

Before the Jets received the opening kickoff, Favre and his new backup, Kellen Clemens, talked briefly on the sideline. Favre clutched a card containing New York's offensive sets and after each snap, he discussed what transpired with quarterback Brett Ratliff, who in an instant went from raw rookie to teaching one of the game's greats.

Favre is eager to put his messy breakup with Green Bay behind him and see, too, the Packer's.

"It's like a marriage that ends," Green Bay president Mark Murphy said. "It happens. Neither party is at fault."

That was Favre's read as well.

"I think we're probably both at fault," he said. "I'm not going to blame one side or the other. A lot of things happened this season, a lot of shocking things. But at this point it's irrelevant."

For the moment, Favre brings the Jets publicity and perhaps a better chance to compete in the AFC East. His preference was to be buried inside the NFC North, preferably in Minnesota. When it became apparent the Packers wouldn't do that, Favre was open to about anything to keep playing.

New York gave up a conditional pick for Favre. According to NFL.com, the selection "would turn into a third-round pick if Favre plays in 50 percent of the plays this season, a second-round pick if he plays in 70 percent and the Jets make the playoffs, or a first-round pick if he plays in 80 percent and the Jets make it to the Super Bowl."

Notice of Proposed Major Utility Facility

Name and Description of the Proposed Facility

American Municipal Power, Inc. (AMP) Ohio proposes to construct an 80-mile transmission line and associated infrastructure for sale and lease in Linton Township and Carter Township, Meigs County, Ohio. This project is known as the AMP US Transmission Line. As required by the Ohio Revised Code Chapter 4906, AMP Ohio seeks a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need from the State of Ohio's Power Siting Board.

Date, Time and Location of Public Hearing:

The Ohio Power Siting Board will be holding hearings where the public is invited to provide written or oral comments regarding this proposed transmission line. The Ohio Power Siting Board has rescheduled the non-adversary hearing that was to be held in September. The non-adversary hearing will be held on October 22, 2008, at 6 p.m., at Southern High School, 920 Main Street, Rio Grande, Ohio, 45771.

The Ohio Power Siting Board has also rescheduled the adversary hearing that was to be held in September. An adversary hearing will be held October 27, 2008, beginning at 10 a.m., at the offices of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215-2723, Hearing Room 1112.

The deadline for filing a petition to intervene as established by the administrator for judge is within 30 days of the publication of this notice. Petitions should be addressed to the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215-2723.

This notice serves as the initial notice published regarding this project and the project's respective hearing dates.

This project includes construction of an approximately 3-mile long 235 kV/mm transmission line and related facilities necessary to move out the electricity generated by a proposed 600 Megawatt net electric generation facility, consisting of two 300 MW net electric generating units, to be built in the vicinity of Letartville, Meigs County, Ohio.

of the Department of Transportation under Section 4906.141 of the Revised Code.

The facility will serve the public interest, convenience, and needs of the area.

The facility's impact on the viability of agricultural land or any land in an existing agricultural district established under Chapter 929 of the Revised Code that is located within the site of the proposed major utility facility and:

The facility incorporates minimum feasible water conservation practices as determined by the Board, considering available technologies and the nature and character of the various alternatives.

Section 4906.02 of the Revised Code provides that:

Upon the receipt of an application complying with Section 4906.01 of the Revised Code, the Power Siting Board shall promptly fix a date for a public hearing thereon, not less than sixty nor more than ninety days after such receipt, and shall conclude the proceeding as expeditiously as practicable.

(1) On the basis of the need for the facility, in the case of a major utility facility described in division (B)(1) of Section 4906.01 of the Revised Code, the Board shall prepare the need for the facility as the need is stated in an application pursuant to division (A)(3) of Section 4906.06 of the Revised Code;

(2) The nature of the probable environmental impact of the proposed facility;

(3) Whether the facility represents the minimum adverse environmental impact, considering the state of available technology, the nature and dynamics of various alternatives and other pertinent considerations;

To the cost of electric transmission lines, that the facility is consistent with regional plans for expansion of the regional power grid of electric systems serving this state and interconnected utility systems, and the facility will serve the interest of electric system economy and reliability;

The facility will comply with Chapters 3731, 4731, and 4741 of the Revised Code and rules and standards adopted under those chapters and under Sections 150.23, 150.31, and 150.32 of the Revised Code. In determining whether the facility will comply with rules and standards adopted under Section 4751.22 of the Revised Code, the Board shall consult with the office of director of the division of multi-modal planning and programs
