MIDDLETOWN COKE COMPANY'S RESPONSES TO THE CITY OF MONROE'S FIRST SET OF REQUESTS FOR PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS

Pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code § 4906-7-07, Middletown Coke Company ("MCC"), serves these responses to the City of Monroe's September 18, 2008 First Set of Requests for Production of Documents.

DEFINITIONS

The following definitions apply to the terms used in these requests for production of documents:

- "AK Steel Middletown Works" means the steel manufacturing facility owned and operated by AK Steel in Middletown, Butler County, Ohio.
- "And" and "or" are both conjunctive and disjunctive and shall be interpreted to call for the most comprehensive information available to Middletown Coke Company.
- 3. "Cogeneration Station" means the steam turbine generator and associated electrical generating equipment to be constructed and operated by Middletown Coke Company at the Facility, as that term is defined below.
- 4. "CO" means carbon monoxide.
- 5. "Documents" include but is not limited to all writings, correspondence, memoranda, letters, summaries, notes, reports, studies, manuals, telephone logs, calendars, charts,

- 9. "Include" or "including" means including but not limited to.
- 10. "Matter" or "this Matter" means the proceedings before the Ohio Power Siting Board for a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need for Middletown Coke Company, OPSB Case No. 08-281-EL-BGN.

- 11. "NO_x" means nitrogen oxides.
- 12. "Person" means any individual, corporation, proprietorship, partnership, professional corporation, association, group, governmental agent or entity, and any other entity.
- 13. "PM," "PM₁₀," and "PM_{2.5}" have the same meanings set forth in O.A.C. § 3745-17-01.
- 14. "PTI Application" means Middletown Coke Company's application for a Permit to Install for the Facility pursuant to O.A.C. Chapter 3745-31, including any drafts or revisions thereof.
- 15. "Sinter Plant" means the former sinter plant at the AK Steel Middletown Works, including but not limited to all equipment, processes, or emissions units included in Middletown Coke Company's netting calculations for said Sinter Plant in the PTI Application.
- 16. "SO₂" means sulfur dioxide.
- 17. "VOC" or "volatile organic compounds" has the same meaning as defined in O.A.C.§ 3745-21-01.
- 18. Where the context herein makes it appropriate, each singular word shall include its plural and each plural shall include its singular.
- 19. Each of the following words include the meaning of every other listed word: "each", "all", and "any".

GENERAL OBJECTION

Middletown Coke Company objects to the definition of "Facility" as set forth by the City of Monroe above. Middletown Coke Company objects to inclusion of the heat recovery coke making facility in the definition of "Facility." The heat recovery coke making facility is not a part of the application that is before the Ohio Power Siting Board. Requests for documents related to the heat recovery coke making facility are objectionable because the information sought is not reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence.

REQUESTS FOR PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS

The Middletown Coke Company responds to the City of Monroe's requests to produce documents as follows:

1. A curriculum vitae or resume for each witness that Middletown Coke Company may call to testify in this Matter.

Response:

Middletown Coke Company may call Ryan Osterholm as a witness to testify in this Matter. Attached is a copy of his curriculum vitae or resume. Middletown Coke Company may call other witnesses to testify. If such a determination is made, additional documents will be provided.

2. All documents and tangible objects that Middletown Coke Company may introduce into evidence in this Matter, to which Middletown Coke Company's witnesses may refer during the hearing in this Matter, or which Middletown Coke Company's witnesses may review in preparation for their testimony in this Matter.

Response:

Middletown Coke Company may introduce the application, affidavits of publication, prefiled testimony, responses to Staff Data Requests, and other documents which have been previously filed or will be filed with the Ohio Power Siting Board.

Objection. This request is overly broad and seeks documents which are not necessarily calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence. See Response to Request for Production No. 3.

5. All contracts or other agreements between AK Steel and either Middletown Coke Company or SunCoke Energy, Inc., or both, which contain terms relating to the construction or operation of the Facility.

Response: See General Objection. Further Objection. This request is overly broad and seeks documents which are not reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence. Further Objection. This request seeks documents that contain proprietary and confidential information.

6. All contracts or other agreements between AK Steel and either Middletown Coke Company or SunCoke Energy, Inc., or both, which contain terms relating to the specifications or quality of coke to be supplied to AK Steel from the Facility, including, but not limited to, any contracts or other agreements pertaining to coke chemistry specifications or coal or coke sulfur content.

Response: Objection. This request does not seek information that is calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence. Pursuant to Finding (8) of the September 25, 2008 Entry of Administrative Law Judge Scott Farkas, "The Board has no jurisdiction over any permits for construction of the coke plant. Therefore, issues related to the coke plant will not be considered

in this proceeding." Further objection. This request seeks documents that contain proprietary and confidential information.

7. All contracts or other agreements between AK Steel and either Middletown Coke Company or SunCoke Energy, Inc., or both, which contain terms relating to the purchase, sale, or allocation of coke generated or manufactured at the Facility.

Response: Objection. See response to Request for Production of Documents number 6.

8. All contracts or other agreements between AK Steel and either Middletown Coke Company or SunCoke Energy, Inc., or both, which contain terms relating to the purchase, sale, or allocation of electricity generated or manufactured by the Cogeneration Station.

Response: Objection. This request does not seek information that is reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence. Further objection. This request seeks confidential information and information of a proprietary nature.

9. All records of the actual cost of coke purchased by AK Steel for its Middletown Works from 2003 to the present. This request does not include coke manufactured at the AK Steel Middletown Works.

Response: Objection. See response to Request for Production of Documents number 6.

Further objection. The request seeks information from AK Steel, a non-party. Further objection.

The request seeks information which may be of a proprietary nature.

10. All emissions data relating to any emission unit at the coke manufacturing facility operated by Haverhill North Coke Company, a subsidiary of SunCoke Energy, Inc., OEPA Facility ID 0773000182, Franklin Furnace, Ohio.

Response: Objection. This request does not seek information that is calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence. Pursuant to Finding (8) of the September 25, 2008 Entry of

Administrative Law Judge Scott Farkas, "The Board has no jurisdiction over any permits for construction of the coke plant. Therefore, issues related to the coke plant will not be considered in this proceeding." Further objection. This request seeks information from Haverhill North Coke Company which is not a party to the case. Further, the request seeks information which is not reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence because neither the Haverhill cogeneration station nor the coke oven at Haverhill North are before the Board in this case. Further objection. Middletown Coke Company further objects to this request to the extent that it seeks confidential and/or proprietary information.

All records of coal sulfur content for coal utilized in the industrial processes at the coke manufacturing facility operated by the Haverhill North Coke Company, Franklin Furnace, Ohio, as said facility is referenced in Request for Production 10, above.

Response: Objection. See response to Request for Production of Documents number 10.

12. All emissions data regarding the Sinter Plant breaker end, including but not limited to all performance test results for the breaker end baghouse.

<u>Response</u>: Objection. See response to Request for Production of Documents number 9.

13. The report of Envisage Environmental, Incorporated dated October 10, 1995, relating to the Sinter Plant windbox.

Response: Objection. See response to Request for Production of Documents number 9.

14. All daily steam production records for each boiler in AK Steel Middletown Works' Boiler Houses 2 and 3 from June 4, 2005 through the present.

Response: Objection. See response to Request for Production of Documents number 6.

Further objection. This request seeks information which is not in the possession of the applicant.

It seeks information from AK Steel, which is not a party in this case. Further objection. This request seeks information which may be of a confidential and proprietary nature.

15. All records of total fuel usage for AK Steel Middletown Works' Boiler Houses 2 and 3 from June 4, 2005 to the present.

Response: Objection. See response to Request for Production of Documents number 14.

16. All documents containing information concerning production levels or rates at the Sinter Plant during the Sinter Plant windbox emission testing that occurred in September, 1995.
