2	actually here representing three
3	different groups. I serve on the
4	Solon Board of Education as one of
5	its members. I serve as the
6	business manager for the Southeast
7	Lyndhurst Schools, and I also am
8	on the subcommittee for
9	electricity purchasing of the Ohio
10	Schools Council. My comments
11	relate to all three groups, and
12	I'll try to share with you tonight
13	how this impacts those groups.
14	First of all, I want to state
15	that we really appreciate the
16	support FirstEnergy has provided
17	to my school district and the 249
18	other school districts that
19	participate in this program. We
20	have had two Energy for Education
21	Programs over the last ten years
22	that have been very helpful to
23	keep the electric rates down.
24	These savings have been used for
25	increased learning opportunities

1	for boys and girls, and to promote
2	economic development in Ohio and
3	for Ohio's future job source.
4	I was very privileged to
5	serve on the subcommittee that
6	negotiated the first deal with
7	FirstEnergy, and it was a
8	tremendous help at that time for
9	public schools in Northeastern
10	Ohio.
11	The current Energy for
12	Education Program II will expire
13	on December 31, 2008, which will
14	cause the electric rates to
15	automatically go up by an average
16	of 13.4 percent. Then any new
17	distribution rate increases and
18	any generation increases
19	authorized by PUCO will top that
20	average of 13.4 percent.
21	Collectively, the loss for
22	the Energy for Education Program
23	II alone will cost the 249
24	participating Ohio Public Schools
25	over 11.7 million dollars per
,

1	year. FirstEnergy's distribution	
2	rate increase in this PUCO case,	
3	and any generation increase will	
4	be additional in addition to	
5	that 11.7 million.	
6	Let me share with you how	1
7	this will impact the school	
8	district that I'm purchasing	
9	energy for. It will be to the	
10	tune of 60,000 13.4 would be	
11	about \$60,300 annually. For the	
12	school district that I'm a board	
13	member, it would be approximately	:
14	\$128,640 annually. Folks, that's	
15	in my district where I	
16	currently work, you're looking at	
17	two or three teachers, and in the	
18	district that I'm a school board	
19	member, you're looking at six to	
20	seven teachers. That's	
21	unfortunate in this time when	
22	there's economic difficulties on	
23	everyone, that somehow we can't	
24	come to an agreement to continue	
25	the Energy for Education Program

3	The Ohio Schools Council is
4	currently analyzing the amount of
5	rate increase that will result
6	from the generation rate in the
7	proposed FE. This analysis is not
8	complete yet, and they anticipate

11	Northeastern Ohio.
12,	This is an unfunded mandate
13	over which we, as public
14	educators, have no control. We
15	would have to cut elsewhere in our
16	budget to fund this increase. For
17	our districts to increase this
18	amount would be a substantial loss
19	to the teaching and learning
20 <sup>°</sup>	process in the schools of
21	Northeastern Ohio.
22	Overall, the loss of the
23	Energy for Education Program II,
24:	and the loss of the special school
25	rates in the anticipated rate

2	generation may increase electric		
3	bills by one-third for the 249		
4	school districts served by the		
5	Ohio Schools Council.		
6	Our district, I know, in		
7	Solon and Southeast Lyndhurst

10	types of losses that we have are		:
11	going to go back and be the burden		
12	of the local tax payer to try to

23	for the people that don't have a
