2.8.1 Termination Liability, cont'd.

- (B) any disconnection, early cancellation or termination charges reasonably incurred and paid to third parties by Company on behalf of Customer, plus;
- (C) all recurring charges specified in the applicable Service Order for the balance of the then current term discounted at the prime rate announced in the Wall Street Journal on the third business day following the date of cancellation;
- (D) minus a reasonable allowance for costs avoided by the Company as a direct result of Customer's cancellation.

Approval of this agreement by the PUCO does not constitute a determination that the terms and provisions for termination, or any resulting termination liability, of the agreement should be upheld in a court of law. PUCO approval of the termination liability language is not intended to indicate that the PUCO has approved any terms or provisions contained therein.
