It has been brought to my attention by the Ohio Consumers' Counsel that Dayton Power and Light has filed a plan for yet another increase in it's rates next year by 5.4 percent in addition to the increase they already received this year. I feel that the rates charged by Dayton Power and Light are already excessive and to increase them more would be absolutely ridiculous. After last September's windstorm, my wife and I were out of power for 10 days, while people across the street from us got their power back on within a matter of hours. Every time I called to complain and find out when we would get our service back on, I was given a different excuse and given the run-around trying to get to speak with a customer service supervisor. In fact, I called your office and was told by a representative there that Dayton Power and Light had not applied for a rate increase and that any request would be carefully reviewed by the Public Utilities commission before being granted. In light of what has been stated now, that statement was proved to be false. Apparently a rate increase had already been granted and I was not told that. Please follow the recommendation of the Ohio Consumers' Counsel and reject this latest proposal for yet another increase in rates for Dayton Power and Light.
