My name is Peggy Lee, and I am a staff attorney with the Athens area office of Southeastern Ohio Legal Services, which provides legal assistance in 30 counties throughout southeastern Ohio. Our Athens office in particular serves low-income clientele in Athens, Meigs, Vinton, and Gallia counties.

Based on my knowledge and experience from over 12 years as a low-income advocate, I support Columbia Gas's request to hold a wholesale auction to determine the "adder" amount that determines how much above the NYMEX rate for natural gas would apply, and thus, determine how much the consumer would be required to pay for the natural gas.

According to the esteemed experts at the Ohio Consumer Counsel, the evidence from auctions previously conducted by Dominion East Ohio and Vectren Energy Delivery of Ohio show that the affected residential consumers will see a reduction in costs from the Standard Service Offer resulting from the auction after the "adder" amount is determined. The fact that this "adder" will remain constant for one year can only help to add at least one layer of certainty to counterbalance the uncertain market price of natural gas.

As we all know, everyone, especially residential
