A simple, reliable universally recognizable access number could make all the difference for a person in need of mental health and recovery services.

The information and referral service in Portage County, United Way's FIRST CALL FOR HELP provides valuable, up-to-date, comprehensive information on mental health and recovery services available in Portage County. United Way's FIRST CALL FOR HELP works collaboratively with the Mental Health & Recovery Network of Portage County, and is actively involved in a wide variety of coalitions, collaboratives and task forces that address a number of community issues and needs. However, many individuals and families in need still do not know how to access the vital community service information and referral available. Designating 211 as a state-wide access number for community service referrals would ensure that residents in our communities get the help they need as soon as possible.
