THE WITNESS: I called Ohio Edison, they came out, and the original time they came out he admitted that the wires were connected, but somehow from the time he left my house and I got the letter back, they said, you know, it was normal, it was nothing out of the ordinary, all this kind of stuff.

I had called Ohio Edison several times and just no kind of customer service whatsoever.

Now, this was last year when I called. It's been, actually it's been over a year since my service has been messed up.

I pay a fee every month for full service, not partial service. The letters from Trevor law firm stated that the wires weren't connected or whatever, the answer to the complaint. And after the hearing they came out, disconnected the wires. The hearing was 7/21 of this year. 7/22 they came out and disconnected the wires.

And so I was there when the guy came out and disconnected the wires. I asked him, I said, "Could you take all that other stuff off?" And I said, "What is that extra stuff?" He said, "Well, I'll clean it up." But there were two little boxes

that's in those pictures when I blew up my pictures,
zoomed in, they were still there. I said, "I would
like for you to disconnect that," I said, "because
that's interfering with my TV."
```

He said -- now, this is what he told me,
I lived in the house 24 years, he told me that the
streetlights was using my line but wasn't using the
electricity. I don't know how dumb he thought I was,
but that was totally asinine, and he had an Ohio
Edison truck and Ohio Edison garb.

Okay. So then he said, "Do you want to speak to my supervisor?" I said, "I certainly do."

He said, "Well, he drove up with me, but he went on."

He said, "I'll call him back for you."

Now, I did see two trucks. He said something to the guy that was going on up to disconnect the wires and he drove on. Well, I waited and waited and waited, and he never came back, he never called me. So finally I called Ohio Edison again saying that.

And she connected me with a Terry Brian,
I believe. When I told him what the guy had told me
about the streetlight using my, you know, my line but
not my service, whatever, he laughed. He said,
"Well, I'll come out and check it out." Well, he

never came. And then when I tried to get in touch with him again, he never responded.

Since that hearing I have spoken to

him -- you -- and the hearing officer. He told me,
he said, well, the lawyer for Ohio Edison, he told
me, he said, "Well, we did what you asked. We
disconnected the wire from the house." But before
they even -- they didn't even agree that it was
connected, okay? All of a sudden, okay, it was
connected, they're disconnecting it.

And I said, "Well, what about those other little things up there?" I said, "Now that everything is digital, they don't need that line actually to go to the other house" because I had analog stations and digital stations.

But he said, "Well, I don't believe that was in the original complaint." And I told him, I said, "I submitted pictures with the original complaint which includes all that other stuff up there. It's not a new claim. It was the same claim."

And so I told him I wasn't satisfied, that I was going to go ahead with the hearing. So then I spoke to the hearing officer, he said, "Well, do you want to talk to him again?" No. It's already

It was messed up very badly before I even

called Ohio Edison. After I called Ohio Edison

nothing's changed. I have given them an opportunity.

I've spoken to them time and time again. I am so

to do all that. Now I want compensation.

  - A. No, but I lived in the house 24 years and I never had a problem until that mess -- fiasco on my service line came up. It doesn't take rocket scientists to figure that one out.
  - Q. Is it your testimony here today that you were paying for your neighbor's usage?
    - A. For a short time, yeah. Then he moved away. And once he moved away, my bill went right back down to the normal. They haven't been there for a long time.
      - Q. When did your neighbor move away?
  - A. In March.
    - Q. March of?
    - A. This year.
- 23 O. So March of 2009.
- A. Exactly.
- Q. Your initial complaint alleges that your

neighbor had tampered with your meter; is that correct?

A. No. I did not state that, nor is it

stated in this. And my neighbor -- there's nothing

What you don't see in here is not what I stated nor I've written.

HEARING EXAMINER: And Ms. Frazier is holding up Ohio Ed Exhibit A when she's making those statements.

- Q. Isn't it true that Ohio Edison came to your property and changed the wiring structure in response to your complaint?
- A. They came, they didn't do the whole job; you were standing here when I mentioned that. They didn't do the whole job, 'cause I was there when he came, and I went out and spoke to the gentleman.
- Q. Is it your testimony here today that your house is still connected to your neighbor's house?
- A. I had just stated that they came and disconnected it. I don't know how many times I must state that for you.
- Q. Have you brought any evidence from an electrician or electrical engineer with you today in

support of your complaint?

- A. You told me -- when I had the hearing, I asked if I could get an engineer or electrician to go up there and change it. His answer was no because that was the property of Ohio Edison. Therefore, I'm coming after you because I have no option but to have you do it, and your company refuses to do it. So that is why we're here. They told me no.
- Q. Ms. Frazier, I don't think you understood my question. My question was do you have a report or any documentation from an electrician or electrical engineer?
- A. My problem was on the post. I was told -- yes, I understood exactly what you were saying. My problem was on the post. You stated to me that I had no right to do anything on that post because it belonged to Ohio Edison so, therefore, no, I had no one come and do anything because I didn't have the right to do it. That's what I was told in the hearing.

THE WITNESS: I'm not too sure. That's the name of the company. It's a German company.

created a work request to investigate

tampering/foreign load on our meter.

It looks like she called back again about the same incident on the 18th, stated that, again, the neighbor had attached --

MS. FRAZIER: No.

A. -- himself to her meter.

HEARING EXAMINER: You'll have your opportunity.

A. She stated I guess it was before the meter, and there's a note here about contacting the police. A note that it's up on the post, second-story meter, and they informed her that they

would send somebody out.

HEARING EXAMINER: For the record, this gentleman was referring to Ohio Ed Exhibit D, the next-to-the-last page close to the bottom.

A. Looks like on the 22nd Mrs. Frazier called back to check up on the status of that notification. Looks like she was transferred over to another representative and they advised her that the notification would be worked shortly and the reference is any day.

Again on the 22nd it looks like she called in again to check on the status, and we advised her that somebody would be coming out to the property.

And on the 23rd of December it looks like Mrs. Frazier called in again about the same issues. I guess there's a comment about outlets that are sparking. It looks like the account manager informed them that the tampering notification is loaded, still to be worked.

Remarks here that the representative said that Mrs. Frazier would not let her explain the options on the account, that she was being interrupted, that she didn't care about what the rep had to say and ended the call. Again, it looks like

the rep didn't have a chance to explain that they
were sending a trouble man out to check the voltage.

She had a complaint about the voltage.

HEARING EXAMINER: And which date are you referring to?

THE WITNESS: December 23rd.

HEARING EXAMINER: December 23rd, okay.

A. And it looks like there's a note she called back in about the status, and it appears that the call center representative quoted -- the trouble man had been to the house, Trouble Man Bean, and reported good voltage at the meter base, that there was not a problem with the voltage that day.

Again December 26th Mrs. Frazier called in, and it looks like the representative advised her that the trouble man didn't find any problems, and she accused the representative of lying or the trouble man of lying; it's hard to say from here. That she -- she also said she was going to go to the PUCO with pictures of the outside of her house, and she kept going on about everything, says neighbor's trying to murder her and --

MS. FRAZIER: Oh, that's a lie.
