Thank you for contacting the Ohio Power Siting Board regarding Buckeye Wind LLC's proposed installation of a wind turbine electric generating facility located in Champaign County, Ohio. The OPSB's mission is to support sound energy policies that provide for the installation of energy and transmission infrastructure for the benefit of the Ohio citizens, while promoting the state's economic interests and protecting the environment and land use.

As a standard procedure with all siting projects, Buckeye Wind LLC's notified the public in newspapers of general circulation that it is proposing to build a major utility facility and hosted a public meeting on June10, 2008 at the at Triad High School Auditoria, 8099 Brush Lake Road, North Lewisburg, Ohio to present information concerning the project and to gather public input.

On April 24, 2009, Buckeye Wind LLC filed to demonstrate environmental compatibility and public need with the Ohio Power Siting Board. Therefore, our staff began their investigation of the application. Resulting from the investigation, staff will make in its report recommendations as to whether the proposed facility will best serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity. This will include any potential adverse health effects to humans, livestock and endangered species. Should the Ohio Power Siting Board grant certification for operation, Buckeye Wind LLC will obtain and provide proof of all applicable permits and authorizations as required by Federal and State entities necessary for utility operations within the state of Ohio.

On October 27, 2009, at 10:00 a.m., the adjudicatory hearing for this case will commence in Hearing Room 11-F, at the offices of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215-3793. On October 28, 2009, a public hearing for Buckeye Wind LLC is scheduled at 6:00 p.m., at Triad High School Auditoria, 8099 Brush Lake Road, North Lewisburg,
