I'd like to let the OPSB know that I strongly believe that Champaign County is not an appropriate location for the proposed Everpower Renewables project. Champaign County is rural in character, but has a widely distributed population of nearly 40,000 people that would be deeply affected in every way by the many industrial aspects of this project. This project will undermine:

- The health and safety of our community. Residents living near turbines with setbacks *greater* than the 914-feet proposed for Champaign County report myriad health problems.
- The local wildlife population, specifically birds and the endangered Indiana bat.
- **Property values**. In other communities with turbines located near residences, people report greater difficulty in trying to sell their homes and property.
- The agricultural character of our community. Our landscape will be
  drastically altered by the installation of 70 giant turbines up to 492-feet in
  height, to which a few existing cell phone towers and grain elevators cannot
  compare. These turbines will involve an enormous number of access roads and
  power lines, forever changing the character of the region from agricultural to
  industrial.

## This project will:

- Not create a significant number of jobs, especially in relation to its overwhelming presence in our community.
  - Not lower our own electric bills. The energy generated will be sold elsewhere, without the people of Champaign County except for a tiny percentage of leaseholders, many of whom don't even live in our community receiving a single dollar from the profits created from the sale of our own wind.
  - Not contribute to our local tax base in any meaningful way, as Everpower, along
    with other wind energy companies, is currently lobbying to lower the current
    utility tax rate.

Furthermore, a project of this scope in an area as populous as Champaign County with setbacks at only 914-feet is unprecedented. The people of Champaign County are not interested in being an experiment about the affects of siting an industrial project so close to a vibrant community, all for the benefit of multi-national corporations.

Champaign County is not the place for this project. I'm asking the OPSB to refuse to grant a site permit to Everpower\Renewables.
