Verizon is submitting tariff pages to revise order cancellation regulations in its Access Service tariffs as detailed following:

- In Tariff FCC Nos. 1 and 11, Verizon is introducing a new option (in lieu of order cancellation) for Special Access Service customers. With this option, if a customer or a customer's end user is unable to accept service within 30 calendar days of the original service date, the customer may elect to commence billing for the service on the 31st day. The new service date cannot extend more than 120 days from the original service date.
- In Tariff FCC No. 14, the above option already exists. Verizon is modifying the regulations to more closely align the option across the footprint.
- In Tariff FCC No. 16, the above option already exists. Verizon is modifying the regulations so that the new service date cannot extend more than 120 days from the original service date and making other text changes in order to more closely align the option across the footprint.

Support material as specified under Section 61.49 of the Commission's Rules is not required with this filing.

This transmittal letter and associated attachments are being filed electronically today via the Federal Communications Commission's Electronic Tariff Filing System (ETFS).
