Name and Description of the Proposed Facility. BP Husky Refining, U.C. ("BP-Husky") has filed on application with the Ohio Power Siling Board for a certificate to construct, operate, and maintain a new 138/69 Kilo-volt ("kV") substation to provide additional electrical power and improve the reliability of the electrical power-feed to the BP-Husky Refinery in Oregon, Ohio. The existing 69-kV power system serving the refinery is not capable of providing the power required to the existing refinery and the addition of the proposed new Reformer 3 process unit scheduled for completion in early 2012. The additional power provided by the 138/69 kV substation will allow the separation of the refinery power supply from the local 69 kV transmission system, allowing for more reliable service to the public and the refinery. The substation will be set back off of the south side of Cedar Point road and will be accessed via a new road between the fenced substation and Cedar and Cedar Point Road. A map of the location is contained at the end of this notice

Application. Pursuant to RC 4906.10, the Ohio Power Siting Board shall not gront a certificate for the construction, operation, and maintenance of a major util-

tty facility, either as proposed or as modified by the board, unless it finds and determines all of the following: (1) The basis of the need for the facility if the facility is an electric transmission line or gas or natural gas transmission line: (2) The nature of the probable environmental impact; (3) That the facility represents the minimum adverse environmental impact, considering the state of available technology and the nature and economics of the various alternatives, and other pertinent considerations; (4) in the case of an electric transmission line or generaling facility, that the facility is consistent with regional plans for expansion of the electric power grid of the electric systems serving this state and interconnected utility systems and that the facility will serve the interests of electric system economy and reliability; (5) That the facility will comply with Chapters 3704., 3734., and 6111, of the Revised Code and

under those chapters and under sections 1501.33, 1501.34, and 4561.32 of the Revised Code. in determining whether the facility will comply with all rules and standards adopted under section 4561.32 of the Revised Code, the board shall consult with the office of aviation of the division of multi-model planning and programs of the department of transportation under section 4561.341 of the Revised Code. (6) That the facility will serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity; (7) in addition to the provisions contained in divisions (A)(1) to (6) of this section and rules adopted under those divisions, what its impact will be on the viability as agricultural land of any land in an existing agricultural district established under Chapter 929, of the Revised Code that is located within the site and alternafive site of the proposed major utility facility. Rules adopted to

evaluate impact under division (A)(7) of this section shall not require the compilation, creation, submission, or production of any information, document, or other data pertaining to land not located within the site and alternative site. (8) That the facility incorporates maximum feasible water conservation practices as determined by the board. considering available technology and the nature and economics of the various alternatives Revised Code Section 4906.7 provides that: IA) Upon the receipt of an application complying with section 4906.06 of the Revised Code, the power siling board shall promptly fix a date for a public hearing thereon, not less than sixty nor more than ninety days after such receipt, and shall conclude the proceeding as expeditiously as practicable. IBI On an application for an amendment of a certificate, the board shall hold a hearing in

the same manner as a hearing is held on an application for a certificate if the proposed change in the facility would result In any material increase in any environmental impact of the facility or a substantial change In the location of all or a portion of such facility other than as provided in the atternates set forth in the application. [C] The chairman of the power siting board shall cause each application filed with the board to be investigated and shall, not less than lifteen days prior to the date any application is sel for hearing submit a written report to the board and to the applicant. A copy of such report shall be made available to any person upon request, Such report shall set forth the nature of the investigation, and shall contain recommended findings with regard to division (A) of section 4906.10 of the Revised Code and shall become past of the record and served upon all parties to the proceeding.
