The Ohio Power Siting Board has set for hearing at this time and this place case number 09-479-EL-BGN, being In the Matter of the Application of Hardin Wind Energy, LLC for a Certificate to Site a Wind Powered Electric Generation Facility in Hardin County.

My name is Gregory Price. With me is Rebecca Hussey. We are the administrative law judges assigned to preside over today's hearing.

Before we take appearances I believe we have a motion from the staff.

MR. MARGARD: Yes. Thank you, your Honor. Warner Margard on behalf of the Board staff. I would like to represent to the Bench that the parties have been successful in their discussions in attempting to reach a settlement of this case. Unfortunately, the final details on the stipulation are not quite complete.

The parties anticipate that they will be able to reach complete agreement on all terms of the stipulation within the hour and request the Bench's

5 1 indulgence to permit them to be able to provide a complete and final stipulation at that time. 3 ALJ PRICE: We would be happy to do so, therefore, we will grant a one-hour continuance until 4 5 11 o'clock. Thank you all. б MR. MARGARD: Thank you, your Honor. 7 ALJ PRICE: Off the record. 8 (Recess taken.) ALJ HUSSEY: Let's go back on the record. 10 We will begin by taking appearances on behalf of the 11 parties. Let's begin with the company. MS. BLOOMFIELD: On behalf of Hardin Wind 12 13 Energy, LLC the law firm of Bricker & Eckler, LLP, 14 Sally W. Bloomfield and Matthew W. 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- Q. And please indicate the purpose of your testimony today.
- A. I would like to provide summary background for the proposed project which is the subject of the application, but more importantly to respond to several comments that were made at the Kenton, Ohio, local public hearing on January 5th, 2010.
- Q. Would you provide the general background first, please.
- A. The project is located in Hardin County,
 west of the city of Kenton, and encompasses portions
 of Cessna, Marion, Lynn, McDonald, Roundhead, and

- 1 Taylor Creek townships. The project area consists of
- ² approximately 36,000 acres of primarily agricultural
- land, of which about 20,000 acres have been leased
- 4 for the wind farm.
- The wind farm will have up to 200 wind
- 6 turbines, each with a nameplate capacity of
- 7 | 1.5 megawatts or 1.6 megawatts. We will generate up
- 8 to 300 megawatts of electricity. Construction will
- 9 involve at least two separate phases. Once
- 10 | construction has begun, there may be occasional
- 11 stoppages in between separate phases.
- Q. Were you present at the Kenton hearing
- when Mr. Michael Smith, the Hardin County Engineer,
- 14 testified?
- A. Yes, I was.
- O. And would you briefly describe the
- discussions that representatives of Hardin Wind
- 18 | Energy, LLC have had with representatives of
- 19 Mr. Smith's office?
- A. Yes. There have been many discussions
- about road issues with representatives of the Hardin
- 22 | County Engineer's office and the company beginning in
- 23 2008 in which Mr. Smith and the assistant county
- engineer, Luke Underwood, were present. Our
- 25 representative initiated the discussion about the

Nine, traffic monitoring during construction;

And ten, enforcement.

The agreement has not yet been signed, but we expect to reach agreement within the next 90 days, before the commencement of construction. Some of the matters mentioned by Mr. Smith, Mike Smith, such as increasing road capacity for our construction, are included in the proposed agreement.

In our discussions we have agreed to many recommendations brought to our attention by

Mr. Smith's representatives. Of course, we recognize that we must meet our obligation with respect to any agreement we reach. We will also be complying with all regulations of the county engineer's office with respect to the use of the county roads.

We agree with Mr. Smith's comments that Hardin Wind's relationship with his office has been very cooperative and forthcoming, and we will continue making positive progress with our host community as part of our good neighbors effort.

- Q. Do you have any response to the matter or concerns mentioned by Mr. Ed Rogers at the Kenton hearing?
 - A. Yes. First of all, Mr. Rogers and his

wife are the owners of about 7 acres near the planned
wind farm. Mr. Bogorg' statements gave the

wind farm. Mr. Rogers' statements gave the

impression that there's some open questions that

4 property owners had. While we have made ourself

⁵ available to answer any questions from property

owners, we have not had any question from Mr. Rogers

about the wind farm. In fact, since the January

8 | 5th hearing we have been trying to contact

Mr. Rogers via telephone and by mail to discuss his

concerns about the project.

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Mr. Rogers raised noise issues to nonparticipating property owners. The stipulation conditions 36 and 37 presented today addresses maximum noise level for adjacent landowners.

Mr. Rogers mentioned interference with microwave, radio, and television coverage as potential concerns. In response to a staff data request No. 48 the company provided detailed studies prepared by Comsearch potential effects of the proposed wind farm on microwave, AM, FM, and television coverage in the project area.

Those studies show that with respect to microwave there are eight microwave path. It identified two potential obstructions with respect to one of the microwave path. Whether obstructions

actually exist will have to be confirmed in a further detailed study which the company will undertake prior to developing the final turbine layout and construction. To the extent that there was interference, they could be cleared by adjustment to the turbines, moving the turbine, and other mitigation.

Comsearch also performed a study regarding television reception interference, noting that there were 17 television stations providing programming to the project area. The study concluded that in no case should any community lose all of its now available TV channels, and in the case that there will be a loss of certain channels, there are mitigation measures such as cable hookups of direct broadcast satellite that are available to cure the issues.

In the event of an alleged coverage loss, after verifying the loss the company will take mitigative actions. The Comsearch report on AM and FM potential interference concluded no impacts were expected.

Mr. Rogers also expressed concerns about the airport in the vicinity. Both the application and the Staff Report addresses potential impacts on

aviation. The company sent its preliminary turbine
locations to the Federal Aviation Administration and
to the Ohio Department of Transportation Office of
Aviation and agreed that, once finalized, turbine
locations that changes will be sent to those agencies
for their review and approval prior to any
construction.

In addition, the company have agreed to stipulation condition 43 that it will meet all recommended and prescribed FAA and federal agency requirements to construct an object that may affect local and/or long-range radar and mitigate any effects or degradation caused by wind turbines up to and including removal of afflicting turbines.

We believe that we have considered all the potential concerns raised by Mr. Rogers and addressed them completely.

- Q. Why do you believe the stipulation should be accepted?
- A. The stipulation essentially incorporates the conditions recommended by the staff in its Staff Report. We have had a number of conversations with the staff about this stipulation including a two-and-a-half hour face-to-face meeting, an hour and a half conference call, and a number of other

telephone conversations. These conversations have been candid and respectful of differing viewpoints and the negotiations have been held in good faith.

Eventually these conversation have led to some modifications of the initially-proposed conditions. The company believe that the stipulated conditions make our responsibilities more clear and also clarify some of the processes that are to be followed as we move forward to construction and operation.

Because of the cooperation of the staff we believe that the conditions set forth in the stipulation represent an improvement of the set of conditions originally presented in the staff report. We think both the project and the public will be better served through the approval of the conditions set forth in the stipulation filed today.

Speaking for the company, we have very much appreciated the staff receptivity to our concerns and their willingness to work out solutions satisfactory to the parties. The staff, the Ohio Farm Bureau, and Hardin Wind Energy, LLC have agreed that the conditions in the stipulation are reasonable and jointly recommend the conditions as well as the entire stipulation to the Board for its approval.
