My name is Alan C Shoop and I am a customer of AEP. I wish to file this formal complaint against AEP for the following reason(s): I was shocked and outraged when I received my bill in the amount due of $\$ 441.96$ with a due date of February 22, 2010. Prior to this my bills had averaged $\$ 120.00$ with a range of KWH usage of 1,000 to 1,679. On this particular bill that I am disputing my KWH jumped to 5,120! I had changed NOTHING.......all appliances in working order, did not use more than in the past, did not do ANYTHING DIFFERENT!!!!!!

AEP did minutely adjust the bill...from $\$ 441.96$ to $\$ 432.69$, which in itself is a joke! I have since paid $\$ 300.00$ towards this bill, which I feel is probably a fair amount since prior to this bill our meter was an "estimated" reading. I am not unreasonable and will pay what I feel is fair......but I have never used this much KWH and I feel that this is AEP price gouging! They have no explanation for me as to how I jump from and average of $1,300 \mathrm{KWH}$ to 5,120 ! And I have changed NOTHING!!! My bill with a due date of March 23, 2010 shows that we used $1,516 \mathrm{KWH} . . . . .$. . with an amount due of $\$ 199.86$. How do you explain this when I as a consumer changed nothing? AEP tried to say that it was a colder winter than usual and etc........well I am a farmer with livestock and I can tell you that this has not been a colder winter than normal!

I would like the Commission to force AEP to consider the bill of 441.96 with a due date of February 22, 2010 to be considered paid in full since as I had stated I have paid $\$ 300.00$ towards this bill which I feel would be a more accurate amount. As a consumer I am basically at the mercy of AEP due to the fact that I can not choose my electric service provider, but I am telling you this is some sort of price gouging! A person does not go from an average of $1,300 \mathrm{KWH}$ to $5,120 \mathrm{KWH}$ and then back down to 1,516 KWH with absolutely NO changes!

I thank you for allowing my voice to be heard!

The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio in case number 09-1095-EL-RDR on January 7, 2010, approved AEP Ohlo's request to Implement its Economic Development Rider (EDA) effective with this bill. The EDR supports industrial customers that retain and increase Ohio lobs. A residential customer using $1,000 \mathrm{kWh}$ of electricity will see an Increase of $\$ 2.17$ per month.

The Public Ulilities Commission of Ohio in case number 09-1906-EL-ATA on January 7, 2010, approved AEP Ohio's request to decrease its Non-Fuel base generation rates. A residential customer using $1,000 \mathrm{kWh}$ of electricity will see a decrease of $\$ 2.64$ per month effective with this bill.

The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio in case number 09-873-EL FAC on January 7, 2010, approved AEP Ohio's request to implement its Fuel Adjustment Clause (FAC) for the first quarter of 2010. The FAC is the mechanism through which AEP Ohio recovers generation fuel costs and related expenses. A residential customer using $1,000 \mathrm{kWh}$ of electricity will see an increase of $\$ 6.60$ per month effective with this bill. The FAC is adjusted quarterly.
