Before I go into the details of my electric bill increase due to the removal of the all electric residential discount. I have two questions.

- . If it is true the all electric residential discount was being subsidized by those without the discount, how much have their electric bills been reduced since June of 2009? My guess would be not one ponny, but that may just be me being
- I've read First Energy and the PUCO have offered a 90-day reprieve. When? Mid-April through Mid-July when usage and bills are typically the lowest for the year?

I believe it is well documented First Energy paid for advertising the all electric discount to encourage the construction and sale of all electric homes. The little bit I remember from my business law class makes me believe this to be a contract. The discount is one of the reasons we bought our home in 1989 and one of the features we had hoped would make our home attractive to future buyers. I'm concerned now if it is even salable.

The discount was removed in June 2009 - and despite First Energy's claim home owners were notified, it didn't happen. When I look at my electric bills over the last two years. what immediately jumps out is from June 2009 through March 2010 my actual electric usage went down 16% when compared to the same ten months the previous year. For the same time period, my electric bill increased 17%.

Even before the rate increase, I had invested in new windows, doors, appliances, and a more efficient air conditioner. I am not sure my house can be made any more efficient, In addition, as empty nesters, I've "closed" down two bedrooms and a bathroom. With baseboard heating this is easy to do. What is next to impossible is converting to gas as an alternative for hearing.

I've attached an Excel spread sheet with my billing information from 2008 to current. An interesting item to note is the "game" First Unergy seemed to be playing over the summer. Through December 2009, by billed amounts were actually close to the previous year. A substantial bump in November, but this is not unusual when the weather turns cold. The low amounts in July and September were due to "estimated" readings, but based on past usage in these months, there was no foundation for the estimated amounts other than to hide the actual cost. But as you can see, the realization of the increase necutred in lanuary 2010.

The more I look at the numbers above the more I am baffled. I've double checked the numbers, so I know they were entered correct. Look in October for example. Usage in 2009 went up 20%, yet my bill only increased 6%. Yet in February, usage went down 19% and the billed amount up 38%.

As I mentioned earlier, I believe this is truly a breech of contract. One that can and should be corrected. The discount should be reinstated permanently and refunds are due for all of the excessive bills already collected. A lot of permanent decisions were made by home owners in the past based on the promised discount. The solution should also be permanent.


