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## NOTICE OF CORRECTED EXHIBITS

Please take notice that on October 14, 2009, Ohio Edison Company, The Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company and The Toledo Edison Company (collectively, "Companies") filed an application for approval of certain transmission and distribution projects ("Application").
