## To Whom It May Concern:

I am writing to request an investigation into AEP Ohio's meter reading practices and faulty billing processes. On two separate occasions, at two different properties, I have been grossly overbilled in Van Wert, OH . The two properties of which I speak were VACANT while AEP was overbilling on my account, hence very little energy was actually being used. After the second incident, I realized AEP was not actually reading my meter, but still using the A (for actual), on my billing statement. We called to request an actual meter reading at both residences, ( 404 Linda St. Van Wert, OH. and 302 N . Jefferson Van Wert, OH.) and were told the meter readings were indeed accurate. I paid the bills after calling and pleading for an actual reading. At the 404 Linda property, I had both my neighbor, Davis Clifton and my realtor, Chet Straley of Straley Realty, verify that the house was vacant and that the heat and lights were off. Also, we had removed the hot tub that was running at the property all winter during the previous year. Remarkably, the winter 2008 utility bills remained exactly at the 2007 years levels when the house was occupied! Clearly, this is not possible.

Similarly, we then sold the 404 Linda property and accepted the 302 N. Jefferson property as down payment and experienced the same bizarre billing practices. While owning the 302 N . Jefferson property we were once again grossly overbilled by AEP Ohio. We called to question the bill and then the bill was only adjusted after I refused to pay it. Subsequently, we reviewed the whole billing issue with respect to both the 404 Linda and 302 N. Jefferson properties, both of which were VACANT when they were overbilled. I called P.U.C.O. to file an official complaint. I am requesting a formal investigation into AEP's practices as they clearly use estimates to bill customers and, in some cases, stick by those estimates even when they are clearly erroneous.

I doubt AEP will refund the approximately $\$ 600.00$ I was overbilled on the 404 Linda property. Therefore, I will not pay the $\$ 100.00$ that I currently owe AEP for the 302 N. Jefferson property until this matter is resolved. AEP has recently sent my 302 N. Jefferson account to a collections agency, C.B.E. Group.

I have noticed a pattern with AEP that is certainly troubling.
