EXHIBIT C

In its May 28, 2008 Finding and Order in Case No. 08-117-TP-WVR, Doylestown Telephone Company ("Doylestown") received a waiver of the requirement set forth in Case No. 06-1344-TP-ORD that carriers operating out-of-territory must reduce intrastate access charges from existing rates to the rate of the ILEC in whose territory that carrier is operating in those "edge out" areas. Doylestown was granted an 18-month extension (i.e., until February 22, 2010) to begin the three-year transition period to reduce its intrastate access service charges in its outof-territory exchanges.

Doylestown does not have and has not had any customers in these "edge out" exchanges since February 2010, and the late filing of this tariff amendment does not cause any harm to any carriers. Nevertheless, Doylestown hereby modifies its tariff to reflect the appropriate rates if it begins serving customers outside its traditional service territory. Doylestown also is amending its tariff to make clear that it is not currently offering service in its "edge out" exchanges. Because no customers are impacted by this filing, no notice is required.
