## CUTTER EXPLORATION, INC.'S MOTION TO ISSUE A SUBPOENA AND MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

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### I. MOTION OF CUTTER EXPLORATION, INC. FOR ISSUANCE OF SUBPOENA

Pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code Section 4901-1-25, Complainant Cutter Exploration, Inc. ("Cutter") by and through Counsel, respectfully moves the Commission to issue a subpoena to HPE, Inc., 2025 Harsh Avenue Southeast, Massillon, OH 44646-7127, for its appearance, testimony and production of documents for deposition in the above-captioned matter on March 22, 2011, commencing at 10 a.m. at the offices of Buckingham, Doolittle & Burroughs, LLP, 3800 Embassy Parkway, Suite 300, Akron, Ohio 44333. The documents requested in the subpoena may also be sent to attorney Clay Keller's attention at this address in lieu of HPE, Inc.'s appearance. The reasons in support of this Motion are set forth in the attached Memorandum in Support.

#### II. MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

Section 4901-1-16 of the Ohio Administrative Code ("OAC") states, in part, as follows:

#### "4901-1-16 General provisions and scope of discovery

- (A) The purpose of rules 4901-1-16 to 4901-1-24 of the Administrative Code is to encourage the prompt and expeditious use of prehearing discovery in order to facilitate thorough and adequate preparation for participation in commission proceedings. These rules are also intended to minimize commission intervention in the discovery process.
- (B) Except as otherwise provided in paragraphs (G) and (I) of this rule, any party to a commission proceeding may obtain discovery of any matter, not privileged, which is relevant to the subject matter of the proceeding. It is not a ground for objection that the information sought would be inadmissible at the hearing, if the information sought appears reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence. Discovery may be obtained through interrogatories, requests for the production of documents and things or permission to enter upon land or other property, depositions, and requests for admission. The frequency of using these discovery methods is not limited unless the commission orders otherwise under rule 4901-1-24 of the Administrative Code.

In turn, OAC 4901-1-25 states in pertinent part, as follows:

### "4901-1-25 Subpoenas.

(A) The commission, any commissioner, the legal director, the deputy legal director, or an attorney examiner may issue subpoenas, upon their own motion or upon motion of any party. A subpoena shall command the person to whom it is directed to attend and give testimony at the time and place specified therein. A subpoena may also command such person to produce the books, papers, documents, or other tangible things described therein. A copy of the motion for a subpoena and the subpoena itself should first be submitted to the attorney examiner assigned to the case, or to the legal director or deputy legal director, for signature of the subpoena. After the subpoena is signed, a copy of the motion for a subpoena and a copy of the signed subpoena shall then be docketed and served upon the parties to the case. The person seeking the subpoena shall retain the original signed subpoena and make arrangements for its service.

\* \* \*

(D) A subpoena may require a person, other than a member of the commission staff, to attend and give testimony at a deposition, and to produce designated books, papers, documents, or other tangible things within the scope of discovery set forth in rule 4901-1-16 of the Administrative Code. Such a subpoena is subject

to the provisions of rule 4901-1-24 of the Administrative Code as well as paragraph (C) of this rule.

(E) Unless otherwise ordered for good cause shown, all motions for subpoenas requiring the attendance of witnesses at a hearing must be filed with the commission no later than five days prior to the commencement of the hearing.

HPE has information and documents relating to the design and fabrication of the Lil Fed equipment that East Ohio has had producers, including Cutter, install in conjunction with the rotary meters. As part of the rotary meter run design from East Ohio, this equipment has caused operational problems for Cutter. Cutter believes that there have been design modifications to the Lil Fred equipment which were directed at attempting to correct operational problems. HPE is the fabrication company that builds this equipment, and it will have documents and information concerning the specifications, design and/or any modifications made to the design of this equipment. Also, HPE should have various communications relating to the problems this equipment has caused producers such as Cutter Exploration.

Therefore, this request for the issuance of a subpoena clearly falls within the scope of OAC 4901-1-16.

#### III. <u>CONCLUSION</u>

For the foregoing reasons, Cutter moves the Commission to immediately issue a subpoena to HPE, Inc. for its appearance for deposition on March 22, 2011 at the offices of Buckingham, Doolittle & Burroughs, LLP, 3800 Embassy Parkway, Suite 300, Akron, Ohio 44333 at 9:00 a.m. The documents requested in the subpoena can also be sent to attorney Clay Keller's attention at this address in lieu of HPE, Inc.'s appearance.

If such subpoena cannot be issued and served to HPE, Inc. in time for it to appear with documents and provide deposition testimony on March 22, 2011, Cutter requests that the

Commission issue subpoena depositions at dates and times acceptable to all parties and to HPE,
