MR. SONDERMAN: Thank you, your Honor. I would like to identify and mark as an exhibit Company Exhibit 1, which is the Ohio Cumberland Gas application for increase in rates in this proceeding. That was docketed with the Commission on June 21 of 2010.

I would like to mark as Company Exhibit 2 and submit for the record the company's proofs of publication of the rate application, which were submitted to the Commission on August 12 of 2010.

I would like to mark as a late-filed exhibit Company Exhibit 3, and seek the permission of the Commission to submit that as a late-filed exhibit. These are the proofs of publication of the hearing in Mount Vernon, public input hearing.

I can tell you that we published in five newspapers of general circulation. We received the affidavits of publication for two consecutive weeks from two of those newspapers. As soon as those are available we'll submit those as a late-filed Exhibit 3.

- Q. Very good. And then in your opinion these were serious and reasonable discussions and negotiations?
  - A. They were.
- Q. And in your opinion does the settlement benefit ratepayers and promote public interest?

and bargaining results in reasonable and just revenue requirements. Again, we reviewed and analyzed and studied the objections that were filed by the applicant. We accepted some, we rejected some, and we modified some.

And the fact that this is not a fully litigated case also saves in rate case expense, so from that respect it is a benefit to the ratepayer and is in the public interest.

  - A. Yes.
