


Exhibit A-13 "Company History"

EXHIBIT B-1: Jurisdictions of Operation

Pro-Star is currently licensed in Texas. We are in the process of completing registration requirements in Illinois and New Jersey. We do not take title to power in any jurisdiction and provide energy consulting services for our clients.

EXHIBIT B-2 "Experience & Plans"

The leadership team at Pro-Star has literally worked with tens of thousands of end use customers around the nation to enter in to retail electric supply agreements in multiple jurisdictions, including all competitive markets in the U.S. and some areas of Canada. Please see Exhibit A-13 for additional details about the background of Pro-Star's leadership team.

Since its inception in February 2009, Pro-Star represents over 500 commercial and industrial clients in Texas and overseas. These clients range in size from over 100,000 MWH annually to as small as 500 MWH annually. These end users became clients of Pro-Star through execution of a consulting agreement which sets forth the relationships between the parties, provides contact information for both Pro-Star and the client, and includes the fees and services that Pro-Star provides to its clients.

Since Pro-Star provides exclusively consulting services and never takes title to electricity or natural gas, we believe that the requirements of Section 4928.10 of the Revised Code do not apply.

EXHIBIT B-3 "Summary of Experience"

While Pro-Star is licensed as an aggregator in Texas, our focus has primarily been on clients who, for a variety of reasons, have elected not to aggregate. However, prior to joining Pro-Star, the leadership team was involved in the three largest governmental aggregations in Texas. Combined, these aggregations have a peak demand of over 1,000 MW. In addition to negotiating standardized terms for all members of the aggregation, the professionals at Pro-Star also used in-house developed methodologies to minimize the risk of cross-subsidies among clients.

As of May, 2011, Pro-Star represents over 500 clients with annualized usage of over 1,750,000 MWH. These clients range in size from over 100,000 MWH to less than 500 MWH and are located all over Texas and in California, Illinois and New Jersey, as well as over-seas. For a majority of our customers, we utilize pre-negotiated contracts with potential suppliers that contain terms that are more favorable than those that are available in an "off-the-shelf" contract. For larger clients with more sophisticated needs, we provide additional contract negotiations as well as more extensive product analysis to help them determine the best product to use to manage their energy purchasing risk.

EXHIBIT B-4 "DISCLOSURE OF LIABLIITIES AND INVESTIGATIONS"

At the time of this filing, neither Pro-Star nor any of its principals or employees are involved in any litigation relating to the business.
