# EXHIBIT A-12 OMA Service Corporation

### Corporate Structure

The OMA Service Corporation (OMASC) is an Ohio corporation, and a wholly owned subsidiary of The Ohio Manufacturers' Association (OMA). It houses the OMA's for-profit activities, including OMA Workers' Compensation Services (a third party administrator of workers' compensation services for OMA members).

The parent company, OMA, is a not-for-profit 501(c)(6) trade association that was formed in 1910 for the purpose of serving the interests of Ohio manufacturers by presenting manufacturers' positions and the effect upon manufacturers of proposed laws, rules, and regulations before the Ohio legislature and state agencies.

The OMA Education and Industrial Development Institute is a separate legal entity related to the OMA and OMASC by virtue of common management. It was created to house the educational activities of the organization. It is essentially dormant at this time.

The OMA Energy Group is a separate legal entity, supported by administrative fees paid by participating OMA members. It intervenes in selected cases before the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio, and advises the OMA regarding energy policy matters. It is wholly owned by its parent company, The Ohio Manufacturers' Association.

# EXHIBIT A-13 OMA Service Corporation

## Company History

The Ohio Manufacturers' Association was created in 1910 as a 501(c)(6) not for profit association, and has operated continuously for more than 100 years. OMA members are manufacturers with Ohio operations who pay annual dues. Associate members of the OMA are non-manufacturing entities with an interest in the mission of the organization; they also pay annual dues. The OMA is governed by a volunteer board of directors. Directors are owners and senior executives of large, medium and small manufacturers with Ohio operations. They serve three year terms. At present, the OMA has a staff of 12 full-time employees, and currently is managed on a day to day basis by its president, Eric L. Burkland. The OMA Service Corporation was founded in 1980, and its Articles of Incorporation were certified by the Ohio Secretary on March 14, 1980. The fundamental purpose of the OMASC is to provide programming benefit to benefit the OMA membership. 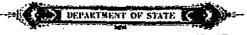

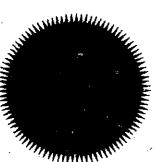

#### ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF



#### THE OMA SERVICE CORPORATION

The undersigned, desiring to form a corporation for profit under Chapter 1701 of the Ohio Revised Code, does hereby certify:

FIRST: The name of the corporation shall be The ONA Service Corporation.

SECOND: The place in Ohio where the principal office of the corporation is to be located is the City of Columbus, County of Franklin, Ohio.

THIRD: The purpose for which the corporation is formed is to conduct the business of a general service corporation for The Ohio Manufacturers' Association and to engage in any lawful act or activity for which corporations may be formed under Sections 1701.01 to 1701.98, inclusive, of the Ohio Revised Code.

FOURTH: The authorized number of shares of the corporation shall be 500, all of which shall be common shares, each without par value.

FIFTH: The amount of stated capital with which the corporation will begin business shall be \$500.00.

SIXTH: The Directors of the corporation shall have the power to cause the corporation from time to time and at any time to purchase, hold, sell, transfer or otherwise deal with (A) shares of any class or series issued by

it, (B) any security or other obligation of the corporation which may confer upon the holder thereof the right to convert the same into shares of any class or series authorized by the Articles of the corporation, and (C) any security or other obligation which may confer upon the holder thereof the right to purchase shares of any class or series authorized by the Articles of the corporation. The corporation shall have the right to repurchase, if and when any shareholder desires to sell, or on the happening of any event is required to sell, shares of any class or series issued by the corporation. The authority granted in this Article Sixth of these Articles shall not limit the plenary authority of the Directors to purchase, hold, sell, transfer or otherwise deal with shares of any class or series, securities, or other obligations issued by the corporation or authorized by its Articles.

SEVENTH: A Director or officer of the corporation shall not be disqualified by his office from dealing or contracting with the corporation as vendor, purchaser, employee, agent or otherwise. No contract or transaction shall be void or voidable with respect to the corporation for the reason that it is between the corporation and one or more of its Directors or officers, or between the corporation and any other person in which one or more of its Directors or officers are directors, trustees, or officers, or have a financial or personal interest, or for the reason that one or more interested Directors or officers participated in or

voted at the meeting of the Directors or a committee thereof which authorized such contract or transaction, if in any such case (A) the material facts as to the relationship or interest of such Director, officer or other person and as to the contract or transaction are disclosed or are known to the Directors or the committee, or such members thereof as shall be present at any meeting at which action upon any such contract or transaction shall be taken, and the Directors or committee, in good faith reasonably justified by such facts, authorized the contract or transaction by the affirmative vote of a majority of the disinterested Directors, even though the disinterested Directors constitute less than a quorum; or (B) the material facts as sto the relationship or interest of such Director, officer or other person and as to the contract or transaction are disclosed or known to the shareholders entitled to vote thereon and the contract or transaction is specifically approved at a meeting of the shareholders held for such purpose by the affirmative vote of the holders of shares entitling them to exercise a majority of the voting power of the corporation held by persons not interested in the contract or transaction; or (C) the contract or transaction is fair as to the corporation as of the time it is authorized or approved by the Directors, a committee thereof, or the shareholders. Common or interested Directors may be counted in determining the presence of a quorum at any meeting of the Directors, or of a committee thereof, which authorizes the contract or transaction.

EIGHTH: The Board of Directors of the corporation may adopt an amendment to the Articles in respect of any unissued or treasury shares of any class and thereby fix or change: the division of such shares into series and the designation and authorized number of shares of each series; the dividend rate; the dates of payment of dividends and the dates from which they are cumulative; liquidation price; redemption rights and price; sinking fund requirements; conversion rights; and restrictions on the issuance of shares of any class or series.

NINTH: No shareholder of the corporation shall have, as a matter of right, the pre-emptive right to purchase or subscribe for shares of any class, now or hereafter authorized, or to purchase or subscribe for securities or other obligations convertible into or exchangeable for such shares or which by warrants or otherwise entitle the holders thereof to subscribe for or purchase any such shares.

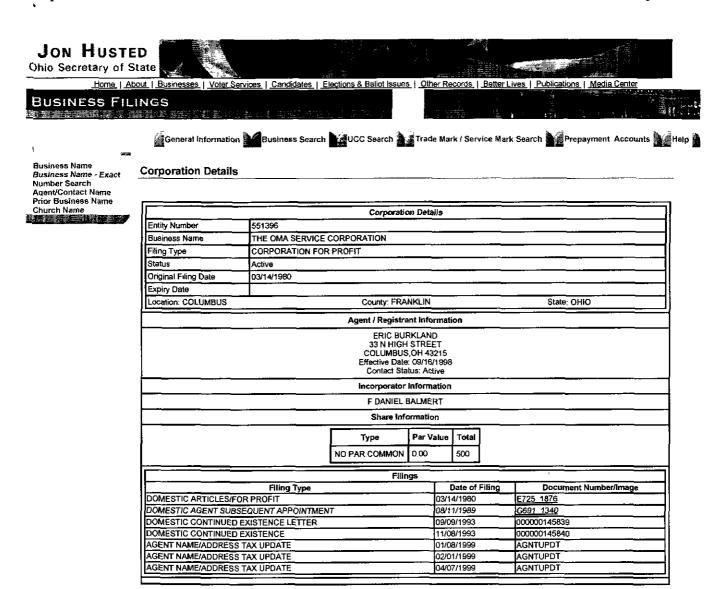

The mission of the OMA is to protect and grow Ohio manufacturing—a mission accomplished through the representation of manufacturers' interests before the Ohio General Assembly and state agencies, the judiciary community and statewide media, with the sole focus of improving business conditions for manufacturers in Ohio.

The OMA has extensive experience in the area of managing and marketing group purchasing programs and services on behalf of its members. The OMA operates a workers' compensation TPA on a fee basis for approximately 800 member manufacturers. It offers a group buying health care insurance program and is a certified Ohio health care alliance. It also operates a group buying and shipping program for members. Throughout its history, the OMA has operated numerous cost-saving programs on behalf of members as a means to help manufacturers be more competitive.

Responding to inquiries and complaints is dependent on the nature of the inquiry. All types of calls will be accepted by the OMA on behalf of the OMASC. The general contact information for member communications is: phone: (800) 662-4463; e-mail <a href="mailto:oma@ohiomfg.com">oma@ohiomfg.com</a>. In addition, Kevin Schmidt, Director, Public Policy Services will be the primary contact for responding to customer inquiries and complaints relating to the OMASC's energy aggregation activities. Calls concerning billing, technical issues, or electric service will be directed to the relevant competitive retail electric service provider or electric distribution utility.

On a more general note, the OMA and OMASC take any member complaint very seriously. The complaints we receive, while very seldom, are communicated to all the relevant staff and managers, including the president, in order to reach a consensus about the best way to respond and/or action to take. Under the OMA's decision making model, what is best for members always comes first.

### Exhibit B-3 "Summary of Experience"

With respect to expertise in energy, the OMA has a long and deep history of defending manufacturers' interests in energy policy. Most recently, OMA played a major role in representing manufacturers in Senate Bill 221. Its experience ultimately resulted in the formation of the OMA Energy Group, a wholly owned subsidiary of the OMA, whose mission is to protect and grow Ohio manufacturing through energy policy.

The OMA Energy Group achieves its mission by intervening in PUCO cases and advocating for energy policy in the state. The OMA also actively promotes the energy efficiency programs of the state's EDUs. For more information about the OMA's focus in energy, see http://www.ohiomfg.com/communities/energy/

More specifically, the OMASC intends to aggregate its members for the purpose of securing a favorable electricity generation rate. It has surveyed its members and found substantial interest and sufficient electricity load to proceed with an aggregation/pooling program. In 2000, the OMASC engaged in similar activities to create an electricity purchasing program with the E Group (hired in 2001 to provide the experience needed on technical issues in order to aggregate manufacturers for electricity purchasing). In fact, the OMASC previously received PUCO certification as an aggregator/broker on January 5, 2001 (see attached certificate). Because the OMASC electricity purchasing program subsequently ended, the OMASC did not renew its certificate, which was cancelled in 2005. Therefore, the PUCO previously concluded that the OMASC satisfied the prerequisites to certification as an aggregator.

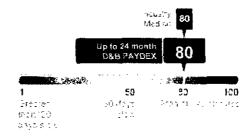
