Special circumstances warrant granting Plug Smart an additional ninety days to file an application on behalf of UH. For the reasons set out in the accompanying Memorandum, the Motion is warranted and should be granted.

MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

Plug Smart is an energy services company that helps commercial, industrial, non-profit, institutional, and utility companies implement a broad range of technology and energy solutions on both sides of the utility meter. Plug Smart's core capabilities include helping clients implement self-funding energy efficiency projects, leverage renewable energy resources, lower power generation and energy supply costs, and reclaiming investments in energy efficiency projects.

Plug Smart files this Motion to Extend the Filing Deadline on behalf of University Hospital ("UH") pursuant to the Second Entry on Rehearing issued by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("Commission") on May 25, 2011, in the above-captioned matter. UH implemented energy efficiency and/or peak demand reduction ("EE/PDR") projects in 2006 and 2007.

On May 25, 2011, the Commission issued a Second Entry on Rehearing finding that EE/PDR projects implemented in 2006 and 2007 are eligible for counting and incentives if they are included in a pending application or if the application is filed within thirty days from the Commission's Entry. May 25, 2011 Entry at ¶15. The Commission

also provided that an applicant may seek an extension of "an additional thirty days if

warranted due to special circumstances." Id. Pursuant to this provision, the

Commission has granted extensions in recognition of the difficulty of navigating

administrative procedures in the short time frame established by the Commission's

Entry.

UH (a non-profit entity) is supplied electric, steam, and chilled water through the

University of Cincinnati and has been paying into the electric rider associated with the

rebate program. Until a very recent clarification from Duke Energy Ohio, Inc., UH did

not realize that its projects to increase energy efficiency could be eligible for counting

and incentives. Therefore, Plug Smart requests that it be allowed to apply for rebates for

energy efficiency upgrade projects completed by UH in 2006 and 2007 because Plug

Smart did not have sufficient time to file an application on behalf of UH. Given the

administrative procedures and the short time frame ordered by the Commission for the

filing of new applications, special circumstances warrant granting Plug Smart an

additional ninety days to file an application on behalf of UH.

In recognition of the challenges posed by the short time frame for filing these

applications, the Commission granted the Second Application for Rehearing filed by

FirstEnergy requesting that customers be granted until March 15, 2012, to file

applications for 2006 and 2007 EE/PDR projects. Special circumstances warrant

granting Plug Smart an additional ninety days to file an application.
