Thank you for contacting the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO) regarding Duke Energy Ohio (Duke). I reviewed the issue you raised and my findings are below.

In your complaint you stated that as a Duke customer receiving electric generation through your local government's government aggregation program, you are opposed to Duke's application Standard Service Offer (SSO) in the form of an Electric Security Plan (ESP). You stated the approval of the company's plan would end the competitive electric environment in the Duke territory. You further stated the company is too large and there is no justification for approving any increase to the rates charged by the company.

Your letter regarding Duke's ESP application has been added to the official case docket for case 11-

3549-EL-SSO. All documents pertaining to the case are viewable on the PUCO's Docketing Information System (DIS) webpage at www.puco.ohio.gov. The case file can be accessed by clicking the link titled "DIS" and entering the case number into the search box. The PUCO is also in the process of holding public hearings regarding Duke's application. The next hearing is scheduled for Friday, September 9, 2011, at 12:30 p.m. at Cincinnati's City Hall, Council Chambers, 801 Plimi Street, Cincinnati, Ohio 45202.
