## FINDING AND ORDER

## The Commission finds:

- (1) The Applicant, The Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company, is a public utility as defined in Section 4905.02, Revised Code, and, as such, is subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.
- (2) On April 2, 1999, the Applicant petitioned this Commission for approval of a contract for electric service with Sherwin-Williams' Consumer Group (Customer).
- (3) The Customer is being required to consider co-generation to help supply its electrical load and to turbine oxidize its volatile organic compound (VOC) which the EPA is going to require of the Customer very soon. The Customer had until the end of 1999 to decide on the co-generation or thermal oxidation process to rid itself of its VOCs. The Agreement encourages the Customer to choose thermal oxidation over co-generation to reduce its VOCs and the Applicant is able to retain the customer's load.
- (4) The Agreement provides that all incremental demand charges, above 300 kWd and 160,000 kWh, shall be discounted by twenty-five percent (25%).
- (5) The Applicant states the approval of this contract will benefit its Customers by retaining load which will contribute to the Company's long term fixed costs.
- (6) The approval of this contract is subject to the determinations and constraints of S.B.3.
- (7) Subject to the terms of this Finding and Order, the application should be approved as filed pursuant to Section 4905.31, Revised Code.
- (8) Even in light of electric restructuring, the Customer agrees that the Applicant shall be the sole supplier of all electric requirements during the term of this agreement.

(9) Our approval of this contract does not constitute state action for the purpose of the antitrust laws. It is not our intent to insulate the Applicant or any party to a contract approved by this Finding and Order from the provisions of any state or federal law which prohibit the restraint of trade.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That subject to the terms of this Finding and Order, the Agreement attached to the application is approved and shall become effective pursuant to its terms. It is, further,

ORDERED, That the Applicant report to the Electricity Division of the Commission's Utilities Department semiannually, in January and July, the results of the Agreement including the increase in load and sales, the total dollar increase in revenue due to the Agreement, and the total dollar difference in the billing at the approved tariff rates and the billing at the contract rates. It is, further,

ORDERED, That the Commission's approval of this contract does not constitute state action for the purpose of the antitrust laws. It is, further,

ORDERED, That nothing in this Finding and Order shall be binding upon this Commission in any future proceeding or investigation involving the justness or reasonableness of any rate, charge, rule or regulation. It is, further,

ORDERED, That a copy of this Finding and Order be served upon the Applicant, the Customer and all parties of record.
