Dear Secretary McCauley:

On October 28, 2009, Ohio Edison Company and Plastipak Packaging submitted a joint application requesting an exemption from Ohio Edison Company's energy efficiency and peak demand rider in exchange for committing energy efficiency projects completed by Plastipak Packaging towards Ohio Edison Company's compliance obligations.

The energy projects completed by Plastipak Packaging involved behavior modifications. Subsequent to the submission of the application in this docket, the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("Commission") issued an order providing guidance that it would not approve rider exemptions for energy efficiency projects resulting from behavior modifications, but would allow commitment payments to customers.

Attached is a revised Exhibit 2A to the joint application to amend the application such that it seeks approval of a commitment payment rather than an exemption from the energy efficiency and peak demand rider. Ohio Edison Company is aware of this amendment and agrees to it.

The rebate also cannot exceed \$500,000 per customer per year, per utility service territory.
