





PARIS — Former French Socialist Party chief Francois Hollande declared victory Sunday in the party's presidential primary, urging the left to unite around his bid to unseat embattled conser vative Nicolas Sarkezy in

unseat embattled conservative Nicobs Sarkozy in elections next year. Hollande, a 57-year-old moderate known more as a behind-the-scenes consensus-builder than a visionary, is seen by many as a wetcome contrast to the tough-talking, hard-driwng Sarkozy. Opinion polis say Hollande is the lethists' best chance to win the presidency for the first time since 1995. Sunday's vote for the main opposition party's presidential nominee comes at a time when many French citizens are wormed about high state debt, cuts to education spending, anemic econspending, anemic econspending, anemic econspending, anemic econservative states and the second of the

ing unemployment. With 2.2 million votes With 22 million votes counted after Sunday's run-off voting, the Socialist Party said 56 percent of the ballots were for Hollande and 44 percent for his challenger Martine Aubry, who had succeeded Hoflande as Socialist Party leader. The party estimates that more than 2.7 million people voted in Sumon people

"I note with pride and responsibility the vote conight, which ... gives me the large majority I had sought," Hollande told supporters in party headquerters as results rolled in.

NAIROBI, Kenya (AP) While putting few U.S. troops at risk, the United States is playing a growing role in Africa's military batties, using special forces advisers, drones and tens of millions of dollars in milltary aid to combat a growing and multifaceted security threat

Once again, the focus is Somalia, the lawless nation that was the site of America's last large-scale military intervention in Africa in the early 1990s. By the time U.S. forces departed, 44 Army soldiers, Mannes and airmen had been killed and

dozens more wounded.
This time the United
States is playing a less visible role, providing intelli-gence and training to fight militants across the coolinent, from Mauritania in the west along the Atlantic coast, to Somalia in the east along the Indian

U.S.-born Israeli released; 25 jailed Egyptians freed

Israel said Thursday that it agreed to trade Egyptian prisoners for a U.S.-Israeli citizen imprisoned in Cairo on unsubstantiated suspi-cions of spying to defuse a potential crisis between the

neighboring countries.

Israel's agreement to such a swap highlights how brittle relations have become between the two since the fall of Egypt's longtime leader Bosni Mubarak, and

want to preserve them, Israel released 25 jailed Egyptians, most of them smugglers, for the U.S.-born lian Grapel, who was arrested to Cairo in June 201 rested in Cairo in June and who previously served in the Israeli military.

The freed Egyptian pris-oners passed into Sinai through a land crossing from Israel TV broadcasts showed some of the Egyptian men kneeling to kiss the asphalt after crossing through a blue metal gate at the beat limited.

At a news conference late Thursday in Jerusalem, Grapel said Egyptian authorities "made sure that I was fed well, respected me and made sure no one harmed me in any way."

Grapel said he was held a "trumped-up allegaon tions." Israel's government, his family and friends in-sisted all along that Grapel

was not a spy.

Many Israelis scoffed at the need for a deal to free a citizen arrested by a friendly nation on what were widely believed to be falsified charges.

Israel Hasson, an Israeli larmaker dispatched to Israel to escort Grapel from Egypt, said the Israeli government agreed to free prisoners to ease tensions.

This event could have developed into a crisis and we don't think either country needs that." Hasson told Israel Radio, "This was not a prisoner exchange. This was crisis prevention between Israel, the U.S. and Egypt."

In 1979, Israel and Egypt signed a U.S.-brokered peace treaty, the first be-tween Israel and an Arab state. Mubarak carefully upheld the accord.

Egypt's new military leaders have vowed to do so as well, but they have taken a tougher stance on Israel and grown closer to its enemy, the Hamas mulitant group that rules Gaza — a coastal Palestinian territory that borders both countries.

Egypt's improved ties with Hamas appear to have helped secure a long-elusive prisoner swap last week, in which Israel agreed to trade more than 1,000 Palestinian prisoners for a single Israeli soldier, Sgt. Gilad Schalit, who was captured and held by Hamas in Gaza for more than five years.


