Highland County Ohio Claim #Case #11-346-EL-550 We are very upset to see the base increase for our electricity. Not only did we have the increase, AEP estimated our bill for December to be paid in January, now we have the large bill in February which includes KWH from the month before the increase was put into place. Our daughter has her electricity with South Central Power, much less per KWH, we are looking into switching. How the invoice is spelled out makes it very difficult to use the bill to figure the \$ per KWH. We also had power surges in December, it took out two tvs, grant it they were very old, but still ours, and to small a price to turn into home owners insurance. We had over 14000 KWH down for the February bill, less than 2000 estimated for December for the January bill, one year ago our bill was \$444, compared to over \$1200 with less than \$200 for December. We cannot survive paying for first, the increased KWH due to the messed up electricity, and second for the increase in price, we are semi retired, how do we pay these, with the taxes coming due the first of March, we are in a very very large pinch here. Hi, I was really concerned about our electric bill when I opened it up...exactly really stressful trying to figure out what was going on. We had a really mild winter and tried really hard to cut back only to open a bill for over \$500. Since last month bill was underestimated I had to combined the two bills to see how much electric I used and then I took last year bill and combined the two bills for the same time period. It turned out we used est 1500 KWH less but had to pay about \$100 more. If we didn't have a mild winter I'm really really concerned how much more would have our electric bill been. We are on the budget plan which was \$190 a month. This increase will make it atlest \$240 a month. Maybe more...really worried because we cut back as much as we could. My husband is 67 and already has to work part time since we have to pay est \$1000 a month in health insurance. We have a son in high school and one in college. I'm not sure how much longer my husband can work but without that job the hike rate will be really hard on us and with this increase it just makes less food on the table. I'm not sure what the solution is but knowing what's going on would greatly be appreciated and what we are to expect in the future. I don't recall a noticed saying our bill will double. RE: Request for immediate intervention in the matter of case 11-346-EL-SSO

Chairman Snitchler,

Please be advised of my community's strong objections to the devastating electric rate and service increases approved by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio last month for the benefit of AEP and its subsidiary companies.

On behalf of the people of Hillsboro, I request that the commission move expeditiously to intervene immediately in the matter of case number 11-346-EL-SSO.

Since the beginning of February, city officials here and elsewhere in Ohio have been deluged with panicked and enraged messages from AEP customers concerned about January 2012 electric bills that have spiked by 1200 percent in some cases.

PUCO's mandate is to provide adequate, safe and reliable utility services at a fair price. At least two of those mandates are now being tested in the case before you and the Commission.

Was PUCO's decision allowing AEP to recover 10 years of deferred debt approved without a plan by the utility to do so reasonably and gradually? How reliable is our system of regulating electric rates from the standpoint of the consumer, when without any tangible public notice, utilities may be permitted to present customers with bills so large and unexpected? It begs the question of what the utilities and PUCO define as reliable service at a fair price.

The Commission's December decision, and subsequent rate increase, also comes in the absence of any macro-economic shock, such as a spike in the demand for generating capacity. Allowing this rate increase, and witnessing the destructive manner in which it was introduced by AEP, is already diminishing the investment outlook by businesses and local governments in 2012.

I urge you and your colleagues to act quickly on this matter in favor of some practical relief for ratepayers. I welcome further communication from you on this issue, and stand ready to assist the Commission in any manner.

Over the last week, I have heard from dozens of small business owners, commercial entities, non-profit organizations and residents regarding their current AEP bills. In all cases, there has been a steep increase with some bills coming in as much as 12 times the previous month's charge without an increase in kilowatt hours usage. These increases are completely beyond the size of those projected in the analyses we reviewed as this issue was moving through the PUCO hearing process in 2011. We are concerned for the businesses we represent and their ability to absorb these increases in our fragile economic recovery.

On behalf of our local economy and business community, I request that you please take immediate action to re-examine the AEP electric security plan (ESP) and the enormous negative impact it is having on Highland County.

RE: 2012 new generation rate from AEP on residential consumer bills

Dear Mr. Snitchler:

I am writing this letter to formally complain about the new generation rate that AEP has imposed upon residential consumers effective January 2012. This inflated rate is unprecedented in my history of being an AEP customer and is unfathomable.

Attached you will find the bill we just received. My wife contacted AEP yesterday and was told by the customer service representative that the tremendous increase is a result of the new generation rate which allows AEP to bill an additional amount of \$.074 per KWH on anything above 800 KWH. As a result of this new rate, our bill has increased over 42% in one month!

Ironically, we are consuming 34% less than we did last year after putting brand new windows in our home over the summer. If we had not made that purchase; our bills would be **double** what they were in cost in 2011! These rates cannot be tolerated or absorbed by residential customers. Our residence is all electric and we **cannot afford to pay for these epic increases**. Based on weather patterns in the winter and our past usage, a **traditional colder January would have meant us paying over 65% more on our electric bill!** The weather will get colder and the bills will be much higher.

Please explain why this new generation rate was approved and how residential customers are supposed to find the funds available to pay for these unbelievable increases. The PUCO's approval of this new rate is going to cost our family over \$2,000 a year! That is more than the cost of living raise I may or may not get this year from my employer.

Your attention to this serious matter is most appreciated as this new rate increase can and will most assuredly force consumers to consider living elsewhere. We cannot afford these increases! I look forward to your prompt response.
