Dear Chairman Snitchler:

On behalf of the Jefferson County Educational Service Center and OME-RESA ITC, located within the AEP Utility Service Territory, I am writing to express strong concern over the alarming increases in electricity rates these districts are experiencing. I urge you to seriously consider the impact these new rates will have on schools and education services to students.

The members of Ohio's education management organizations throughout the state – the Buckeye Association of School Administrators, the Ohio Association of School Business Officials and the Ohio School Boards Association – are very concerned about recent developments with AEP and their PUCO approved ESP. They are the school board members, superintendents, treasurers and business managers responsible for the leadership and management of the public school districts across the state. ESCs and ITCs work hard to provide and support high quality education opportunities for students, a job that has become increasingly difficult in the current economic climate.

Rate increases, such as those that are becoming evident with the new ESP, will be devastating to school districts. These new rates will mean further cuts in staff and programs if nothing is done to alleviate the impact on schools.

While it is too soon to know exactly how many districts and school buildings are affected by the increases, early analysis shows that hundreds are seeing double-digit percentage increases, some in excess of 50%. The actual dollar increases affecting schools with the recent mild temperatures are significant. When more normal winter and summer usage occurs, these increases will be even more drastic.

The following are observations based on our initial research:

- The tariff for school buildings does not necessarily reflect their "load" and typical usage (school buildings are generally shut down at the time of peak usage for the typical commercial customer, i.e., after 4:00 PM).
- The data assumed in the PUCO's consideration of the AEP ESP was not sufficient to realize the extreme effects on some customers, and on school districts in particular.
- School buildings utilizing 3rd party supply are experiencing significant increases, diminishing the net benefit of utilizing competitive 3rd party supply opportunities.



Dear Chairman Snitchler,

We are writing to express our strong concern over the increases in electricity rates we are experiencing. We urge you to seriously consider the impact these new rates will have on our school district and the services we provide to our students and community.

Over the past several years we have undertaken a variety of measures to reduce our electricity costs including the implementation of a number of energy savings projects. We also along with a number of other school districts have taken advantage of the opening of the electricity markets, by leveraging those markets we were able to see significant reductions in the cost of electricity. We were counting on those savings to help us maintain our student focused programming during the current economic downturn. Because of the rate increases we no longer have that option.

In order to fully gauge the impact of these recent AEP rate increases we asked an energy expert to compare our electricity costs based upon our actual energy usage for the period of October 2010 to November 2011 using both the prior tariff rates and the new rates. That analysis showed that using the previous tariff rates our electricity costs were \$485,897.26. Using the new rates our annual cost is projected to be \$623,000.11. That is an increase of slightly over 28%. That projected increase of \$137,102.85 equates to roughly two teachers or more than half of our entire diesel fuel bill for the entire school year. It is an extremely significant negative impact to our operating budget.

Please note that because of our group purchasing efforts we have a fixed price for the electricity supply so the entirety of this projected increase is a result of the new AEP pricing structure.

When we learned of these increases we inquired with our AEP representatives about what steps we could take to move to a tariff with more beneficial rate. The response we received from AEP was that under the new tariff we were locked in at the tariff we were at as of January 1 until there was a new rider schedule approved. Here is the pertinent text from that response:

The GS2 and GS3 tariffs refer back to the tariff sheets before 2012. In general, accounts that had a load factor below 35% were better off on a GS2 tariff. Accounts with a load factor greater than 35% were better off on a GS3 tariff. Load factor is just a ratio of how many kWh used in a given time frame compared to how many kWh could have been used based upon the peak demand during that time frame. Every year, AEP representatives would do a rate analysis to determine if accounts were on the most economical tariff. If not, they would send notices to these customers and advise them that there could be a potential savings by

switching tariffs.

With the new tariffs, there is no difference between GS2 and GS3 except for the riders. There are really four (4) riders that refer back to the old GS2 / GS3 tariff schedules:

- Transmission Cost Recovery Rider*
- EE/PDR Cost Recovery Rider*
- Market Transition Rider*
- Load Factor Rider*


These riders contain language that state "For purposes of this Rider, the determination of the applicable Rider charge/credit is based on the customer's service schedule as of January 1, 2012." So, even if a customer changes tariff schedules, the rider does not change. It follows the account until the rider schedule goes away.

As you can see they have made a major change in the way they do business. They used to work with customers to identify the best rate, they no longer are willing to do that and were given permission to adopt that rather customer unfriendly position in the rider approval process.

In summary, we strongly urge you to reconsider both the rate schedules and the provisions of the riders that do not permit AEP customers to move to other tariff schedules if they qualify and it provides them a better rate.

On behalf of the Meigs Local School Board located within the American Electric Power (AEP) Utility Service Territory, we are writing to express strong concerns over the alarming increases in electricity rates that we are experiencing. We urge you to seriously consider the impact these new rates will have on our school and education services to our students.

We are very concerned about recent developments with AEP and their PUCO approved ESP. Our school board members, superintendent, treasurer and administrators are responsible for the leadership and management of our tax payers funds. We work very hard to provide high quality education opportunities for all students, a job that has become increasingly difficult in the current economic climate.

Rate increases, such as those that are becoming evident with the new ESP, will be devastating to all school districts and especially districts with low wealth, such as ours. These new rates will mean further cuts in staff and programs if nothing is done to alleviate the impact on schools.

Our district alone experienced a forty-eight (48%) percent increase in our electric bill and is estimated to increase in excess of \$30,000 per year, for one building; namely, Meigs Middle School. The actual dollar increases affecting schools with the recent mild temperatures are significant. When more normal winter and summer usage occurs, these increases will be even more drastic!

The following are observations based on the initial research of our supporting organizations:

- a) The tariff for school buildings does not necessarily reflect their "load" and typical usage; in other words, school buildings are generally shut down at the time of peak usage for the typical commercial customer (i.e., after 3:00 P.M. and between the months of June and August).
- b) The data assumed in the PUCO's consideration of the AEP ESP was not sufficient to realize the extreme effects on some customers, and on school districts in particular.
- c) School buildings utilizing 3rd party supply are experiencing significant increases, diminishing the net benefit of utilizing competitive 3rd party supply opportunities.

On behalf of Wynford Local School District located within the AEP Utility Service Territory, I am writing to express strong concerns over the alarming increases in electricity rates our district is experiencing. I urge you to seriously consider the impact these new rates will have not only on our district, but on all schools and education services to all students.

In conjunction with the members of Ohio's education management organizations throughout the state – the Buckeye Association of School Administrators, the Ohio Association of School Business Officials, and the Ohio School Boards Association – we are very concerned about recent developments with AEP and their PUCO approved ESP. As educational leaders that are responsible for the leadership and management of the public school districts in Ohio, we have worked hard to provide high quality education opportunities for students. We have taken steps to cut costs where we can, but with decreased State funding, the loss of tangible personal property revenue, and unexpected increased costs such as this expense, it is becoming increasingly difficult to maintain that high quality education in the current economic climate.

This rate increase with the new ESP will be devastating to our District. These new rates could mean further cuts in staff and/or programs if nothing is done to alleviate the impact to our schools.

While we have only received one invoice from AEP with the new rates, it appears that our district will see double-digit percent increases, a minimum 35% increase that is expected to be closer to a 45% increase under typical climate conditions. The actual dollar increase affecting us when considering the recent mild winter temperatures will be significant in a "normal" winter and as the warmer air is experienced in the summer months.

Some items should be noted:

- The tariff for school buildings does not necessarily reflect our "load" and typical usage (school buildings are generally shut down at the time of peak usage for the typical commercial customer, i.e. after 3:00 p.m. and between June and August).
- The data assumed in the PUCO's consideration of the AEP ESP was not sufficient to realize the extreme effects on some customers, and on school districts in particular.

- School buildings utilizing third party suppliers are experiencing significant increases, diminishing the net benefit of utilizing competitive third party supply opportunities. This fact applies to Wynford Local School District who attempted to be good stewards of its resources and contracted with First Energy Solutions in July, 2011, to lock into an average \$5.89 rate only to find out this week that the rate is now increasing to match that of AEP at a rate of \$7.34, a 25% increase. The effect of these increases may essentially wipe out the savings we budgeted based on what the estimated savings would be throughout the life of the signed agreement with the third party supplier.

Because of the negative effects the new ESP is having on school districts, the Wynford Local School District administration and Board of Education urges you to reconsider the original PUCO decision of approval. These increases will, in turn, have a negative impact on our students. We ask that you consider a special rate for school districts that more fully recognizes our favorable usage patterns. Additionally, we request that you lift the capacity cap for all schools in order that savings could be achieved through third party generation supply which would allow us to preserve the fixed cost generation third party agreement we entered into in July, 2011.



AEP OHIO Messages

AEP's distribution rate Case No. 11-351-EL-AIR, resulted in a revenue increase and a new Distribution Asset Recovery Rider which was approved to collect the cost of previous distribution system improvements and expenses.

The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio adopted two agreements that will determine electric generation and distribution rates for AEP-Ohio customers beginning January 1, 2012. AEP's Electric Security Plan (ESP), in Case No. 11-346-EL-SSO, resulted in a merger of Columbus Southern Power and Ohio Power and a transition to a market-based generation rate in 2015.

In Case No. 11-281-EL-FAC, AEP implemented its Fuel Adjustment Clause (FAC), which is the mechanism through which AEP Ohio recovers generation fuel costs and related expenses.

Pursuant to state law, the Universal Service Fund rider rate has been adjusted effective with this bill.

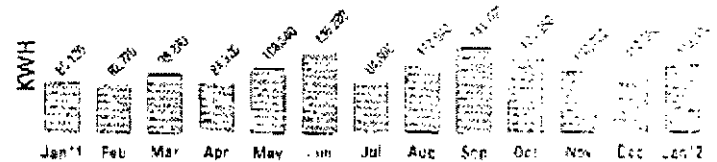

On behalf of the Metropolitan Educational Council (purchasing cooperative) membership located within the AEP Utility Service Territory, I am writing to express strong concerns over the alarming increases in electricity rates those districts are experiencing. We urge you to seriously consider the impact these new rates will have on schools and education services to students.

The members of Ohio's educational purchasing cooperatives throughout the state – The Ohio Council of Educational Purchasing Consortia – are very concerned about recent developments with AEP and their PUCO approved ESP. They work hard to provide high quality education opportunities for students, a job that has become increasingly difficult in the current economic climate. Rate increases such as those which are becoming evident with the new ESP will be devastating to school districts. These new rates will mean further cuts in staff and programs if nothing is done to alleviate the impact on schools.

While it is too soon to know exactly how many districts and school buildings are affected by the increases, early analysis shows that hundreds are seeing double-digit percentage increases, some in excess of 50%. The actual dollar increases affecting schools with the recent mild temperatures are significant. When more normal winter and summer usage occurs, these increases will be even more drastic.

Because of the egregious nature of the effects the new ESP is having on school districts, we urge you to reconsider the original PUCO decision of approval. We also ask that you consider a special rate for school districts that recognize their favorable usage patterns. Additionally, we request that you lift the capacity cap for all schools in order that savings could be achieved through 3rd party supply.
