The CEO of American Electric Power (AEP) was quoted in The Columbus Dispatch as saying that AEP felt "drawn and quartered" due to the recent PUCO order for AEP to revert back to earlier rates instead of charging the most recent significant rate increase I must admit that my wife and I felt the same way when we received our surprise electric bill after the rate increase went into effect. Dear Chairman Snitchler:

Mount Vernon is in AEP Ohio's service area. As a community whose residents just voted to approve a governmental aggregation program, we are genuinely concerned that the proposed settlement of AEP's Electric Security Plan (ESP) will effectively bring this type of discount program to an end for the next few years.

The proposed settlement includes unreasonable provisions which serve as caps or limitations on shopping and will limit the number of residents allowed to switch electric suppliers each year. Once this cap is hit, our community – and others like ours – will be effectively shut out from enjoying any savings. Hundreds of other Ohio communities in neighboring utilities are receiving savings through their aggregation programs. Why are we being penalized for being AEP customers? And why should AEP be able to dictate which groups of residents and businesses are allowed to save money on their electric bills?

It is the policy of Ohio to ensure effective competition in the provision of electric service and it is the PUCO's mission to facilitate an environment that provides competitive choices. We ask that you encourage large-scale governmental aggregation as required by Ohio law by rejecting or significantly altering this settlement agreement to remove the caps. However, if the shopping caps are going to be implemented, we propose that governmental aggregation communities be exempted from the caps.

Our community can obtain significant savings on our electric generation supply because other generation suppliers are competing for the business. It's apparent that AEP is attempting to prevent competitive suppliers from serving customers in their service area. And if they are successful, the people and businesses in communities like Mount Vernon will miss out on these savings. Other communities in Ohio have this opportunity to save and so should we.

Governor Kasich,

I am the owner of a small business located in Kenton, Ohio. I recently received an electric bill from AEP that I thought was surely a mistake. After having my General Manager call to both AEP and PUCO, I have been informed my 100+% power increase was not a mistake.

I would like to affirm the message my General Manager delivered to both AEP and PUCO. Golden Giant Inc. is in the business of designing, fabricating and erecting engineered steel buildings. I believe we are the last manufacturer of steel buildings in Ohio. We receive calls on a monthly basis from economic development coordinators (EDC'S) representing other States and Municipalities, asking us to consider relocating our business. To date we have not engaged EDC's for the purposes of relocating. While I truly would like to find a way to continue manufacturing here in Ohio the latest power increases give us reason to explore our options.

A recap of our conversations with both AEP and PUCO;

- AEP, the hikes were driven PUCO over distribution costs... •
- PUCO interestingly did not know power prices in AL, GA, TN, TX or NC (all states where EDC's have contacted us in the past 12 Months). It also seemed like they were surprised this could costs jobs.
- Jan. 2011 billing rate 8.87 vs. Jan. 2012 billing rate 13.15 ¢ per kw

Feb. 2011 billing rate 9.88 vs. Feb. 2012 billing rate 19.82 ¢ per kw (+106%)

Governor, unless this power rate increase is adjusted, we will need to take action that at a minimum will have us outsourcing from other states those items we manufacture that are "energy/power" intensive. In the press release on PUCO website it discusses "what other benefits are included in the ESP? AEP, will contribute \$5 million annually from 2012 to 2015 to the Ohio Growth Fund for economic development and \$3 million to the Partnership Ohio Fund. It seems like there were lobbyist representing everyone but small business at the table. Let's focus giving businesses already established in Ohio reason to stay here vs. reason to consider outsourcing or leaving.
