On February 27, AEP Ohio filed a motion for relief and expedited action with the PUCO to halt the financial losses sustained as a result of the Commission's decision on February 23 to revoke its approval of the company's ESP plan, which the Commission had approved on December 14

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and modified on January 23. AEP has requested that the Commission set the capacity charge that alternative suppliers must pay to use AEP's generating assets at \$255/MWday until a final ESP has been approved.
