- 1 1. Q. Would you please state your name, business address and position?
- 2 A. Sue Daly, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215-3793. The
- Public Utilities Commission of Ohio employs me as a Utility
- 4 Specialist III, Water/Wastewater Section, Rates and Tariffs, Energy
- 5 and Water Division of the Utilities Department.

- Q. Please summarize our responsibilities with the Public Utilities
 Commission.
- A. The duties include planning the review and evaluation of tariff and rate issues in various proceedings before the Commission. This involves preparing the Staff Report of Investigation, analyzing data filed by the utility companies, preparing and/or reviewing necessary documentation and workpapers based on the results of the investigation and preparing and presenting testimony in support of the Staff's position.

- A. I graduated form Ohio State University in September 1982 with a

 Bachelor's Degree in Finance. In December 1979, I began at the

 Public Utilities Commission as a Utility Rate Specialist in the

Electric Section of the Rates and Tariffs Division. I began my current duties with the Commission in October 1984. I have attended various seminars and rate case training programs sponsored by this Commission. I have previously testified before the Commission.

- Q. Briefly state your activities in connection with professional
 organizations and associations.
 - I am the Chair to the National Association of Regulatory Utility A. Commissioners (NARUC) Staff Subcommittee on Education and Research, past co-chair of the NARUC Staff Subcommittee on Water and a member of the NARUC Staff Subcommittee on Critical Infrastructure, a member of the Ohio Water Resources Council, the State Coordinating Committee on Ground Water, and the Drinking Water Advisory Committee, an Advisor to USEPA Region V on the topic of Capacity Development, and the National Associations of Water Companies (NAWC), Small Companies Committee. I am also a member of the American Water Works Association. I am an instructor for the NARUC Water Rate School. I have authored the following publications: small Water Company Regulation: Choices for Commissions, 1998; Capacity Development Program PUCO Water/Wastewater Companies, 1998; And Why Isn't Water Free?

- 1 1997. I have written several articles for the NAWC magazine
 2 "Water". I authored the "Water Conservation" brochure and "The
 3 Price of Safe Drinking Water" handout for the Public Utilities
 4 Commission of Ohio.
- 5 5. Q. What is the purpose of your testimony?
- A. The purpose of my testimony is to address the objections to the Rates and Tariffs portion of the Staff Report.

- 9 6. Q. Are there any corrections which should be made to the Staff Report of Investigation?
- 11 A. Yes. In the Joint Application of American Water Works Company, Inc., Ohio American Water Company and Aqua Ohio, Inc. for 12 13 Approval of the Purchase of Common Stock of Ohio American 14 Water Company by Aqua Ohio; Inc., Case No. 11-5102-WS-ATR, all parties signed a Stipulation and Recommendation on January 27, 15 16 2011. The stipulation contained the following statement: "Because 17 any change in Operation and Maintenance Expense that my occur under the ownership and management of Aqua during the rate 18 effective period cannot necessarily be known with certainty at this 19 time, the Signatory Parties recommend to the Commission and agree 20 that test year Pro Forma Operation and Maintenance expense in the 21 22 Pending Rate Case remain at the level approved as just and

1	reasonable in Case No. 09-391-WS-AIR." In its Finding and Order
2	journalized February 14, 2012, the Commission ordered that Ohio
3	American and Aqua comply with the terms of the Stipulation. As
4	the Stipulation and later approval of such were done after the Staff
5	Report of Investigation was issued, Staff proposed miscellaneous
6	charges (reconnection, account activation and dishonored payment)
7	as well as Staff recommended softening and reverse osmosis
8	surcharges should be recalculated using the costs from Case No.
9	Case No. 09-391-WS-AIR.
10	In addition, to the degree that Staff errored in the calculation of

In addition, to the degree that Staff errored in the calculation of Federal Income Tax Expense Adjustment, the softening and reverse osmosis surcharges should be corrected accordingly.

- Q. What is Staff's recommendation concerning the customer charge?
- 15 A. As stated in the Staff Report of Investigation, page 345, "Staff recommends that regardless of the amount of revenue authorized by the Commission, Staff's recommended customer charges not be altered."

The exclusion of hydrants and a portion of a management fee were approved in prior Case No. 09-391-WS-AIR, and therefore, also excluded in this case.

- 1 8. Q. What is Staff's recommendation concerning the Low-income
 2 Assistance Program?
- A. H2O is a low-income assistance program where contributions made
 by customers and employees for bill payment assistance to
 residential customers are matched up to \$500 per month by the
 Company. Staff finds this to be a reasonable arrangement.
- 7 9. Q. Does this conclude your prepared testimony?
- 8 A. Yes it does.
