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1 Monday Evening Session, 2 March 5, 2012. 3 THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: The Public 4 5 Utilities Commission of Ohio has assigned for public 6 hearing at this time and place, Case No. 7 11-4161-WS-AIR, captioned In the Matter of The 8 Application of Ohio American Water Company to 9 Increase Its Rates for Water Service and Sewer Service. 10 11 My name is Katie Stenman. I am one of 12 the attorney examiners assigned by the Commission to 13 hear this case. 14 Presiding with me this evening is 15 Commissioner Cheryl Roberto. In the room are members 16 of the Public Utilities Public Affairs office, and 17 they're present tonight and available to answer any questions concerning the utility matter. 18 19 At this time I'd like to take appearances 20 on behalf of the parties, starting with the company. 21 MS. THOMPSON: Good evening, your Honor. 2.2 My name is Melissa Thompson, and I am here 23 representing Ohio American Water Company, with the 24 firm of Whitt Sturtevant, LLP, 155 East Broad Street, 25 Columbus, Ohio 43215.

THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: On behalf of 1 2 Consumers' Counsel. 3 MS. YOST: Thank you. On behalf of the Office of the Ohio Consumers' Counsel, Melissa Yost, 4 5 10 West Broad Street, Suite 1800, Columbus, Ohio 6 43215. 7 THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Thank you. Do we 8 have any other intervenors with us tonight? 9 MR. KENNEDY: I'm Steve Kennedy, Prairie Township Trustee, and we are an intervenor; address 10 11 6621 West Broad Street. 12 THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Okay. But their 13 attorney isn't present? 14 MR. KENNEDY: The attorney isn't present. 15 THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: You will not be 16 giving testimony? MR. KENNEDY: Not on behalf of the 17 intervenor. 18 19 THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Thank you. 20 In August of last year, Ohio American 21 Water Company filed this application for a rate 2.2 increase. In its application Ohio American requested 23 a 22 percent revenue increase for water services and 24 a 12 percent increase for wastewater service. 25 The PUCO Staff Report was issued in

1	January of this year. For Franklin County the staff		
2	recommended a 10.34 to 12.2 percent increase over		
3	current revenues for water service and 7.07 to		
4	8.97 percent increase over current revenues for		
5	wastewater service. Staff also recommended lowering		
6	the customer charge from the current 9.51 to 8.55.		
7	The Staff Report is a recommendation		
8	only. The five PUCO Commissioners may implement some		
9	of the suggestions and reject others.		
10	The purpose of this evening's public		
11	hearing is to receive comments from the public		
12	regarding Ohio American's application in this case.		
13	It is not a question and answer session, but it is		
14	your opportunity to let the Commission know what you		
15	think about Ohio American's request.		
16	The local public hearings in this case		
17	are only one aspect of the process. An evidentiary		
18	hearing is also scheduled to commence on March 26,		
19	2012, at the Commission's office here in Columbus.		
20	When you arrived, you were offered the		
21	opportunity to sign up and testify. After I finish		
22	my introduction, I will begin calling witnesses		
23	forward who have signed up on the sign-up sheet.		
24	If you have not signed up, I will give		
25	you an opportunity after taking those witnesses		

first.

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Before you give your comments, I'll ask you to state your name and address for the record, and before you present your testimony, I will ask you to take an oath, swearing what you're about to tell us the truth.

Your testimony will be considered part of the official record in this case, and it will be reviewed by the Commission before they make their final decision regarding the application.

Additionally the parties to the case and I will be permitted to ask you questions about your testimony. Should you decide you do not want to testify, when I call your name, you may simply pass. Also, once you finish testifying or if you're just here to observe, you may leave at any time.

As a side note, tonight's hearing is being transcribed by a court reporter. If you plan to testify, please speak plainly and clearly so she can accurately reflect your testimony, and also, if you prepared a prewritten statement, please give her a copy when you complete your testimony. At this time I will begin calling

24 witnesses forward starting with Morgan Gierman.

1	MORGAN GIERMAN,	
2	being first duly sworn, as prescribed by law, was	
3	examined and testified as follows:	
4	DIRECT TESTIMONY	
5	My name is Morgan H. Gierman. I live at	
6	1456 Brenthaven Drive. I am the president of the	
7	Timberbrook Homeowners Association. I represent 370	
8	homes, which approximately 300 of them are on the	
9	Ohio American Water system, not the wastewater	
10	system.	
11	We have been doing this type of exchange	
12	for quite a while now, and we are opposed to any	
13	increase as an association. My premise of that is	
14	and I don't necessarily have any facts or data with	
15	me but in this economy, which I think if you read	
16	the papers, there's not a lot of people getting	
17	increases, period, and I think it's a very poor time	
18	to put more burden of expenses on the residents who	
19	aren't getting compensated to pay more out of	
20	pocket from whom they're employed to.	
21	There's a lot of foreclosures in	
22	Timberbrook. As far as my being the sitting	
23	president, it's probably at an all-time high, so	
24	there's still lots of people hurting out there.	
25	And it's my understanding, through	

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talking to Mr. Kennedy and through some of the
things, that Ohio American Water is about to be
acquired or bought or purchased by Aqua, and the
representatives of Aqua are sitting in the room. We
are very reasonable people. We do have meetings at
least two to three times a year, of which I will do
my best to make you aware of because we don't want to
create this aspect that we're not approachable.

9 We do put out a newsletter with which we 10 don't mind you all being quoted in or, you know, 11 having a say, but as it stands here, it's my 12 understanding that this water issue is not governed 13 in the same way our gas and our electric is in 14 regards to the accountability factors of how they do 15 their business, in regards to how they get their 16 increases.

And as the sitting president, I have been indirectly involved in pursuing legislation to bring people like Ohio American Water and Aqua under the same umbrella as the other utilities which I mentioned, and we feel that that's fair.

And, so, you know, that's where we come from, and that's our position, and I will be more than happy after the meeting is over to talk to anybody. I'm here representing 370 homes, of which,

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1	as I said, at least 300 are on your system, and, you		
2	know, we want to know you because we need the water.		
3	I'm not going to be one of those types of		
4	individuals who come up here and tell you I don't		
5	like the water. I do, and I pay a little bit extra		
6	at my house to make it softened and reverse		
7	osmosized, and I believe it's the best water that		
8	money can buy. But I pay extra for that, not a lot		
9	of people do, and I like it and everyone that comes		
10	to my house likes it.		
11	With that, I'm not going to stand up here		
12	and tell you your water's terrible. I think it's		
13	great. But the increases at this time I think needs		
14	to be rethought and ideas how to make increases maybe		
15	more incremental because I do realize, too, that		
16	costs have to go up, the cost-of-living raises and		
17	things like that. I mean, that's common sense, and I		
18	know of that.		
19	And so we're open to those types of ideas		
20	and avenues so that, you know, like, people who were		
21	here two or three years ago when we were dealing with		
22	an increase that was, you know, in the 20 percent		
23	plus bracket, you know, and it was thrust upon us		
24	like it's no big deal, and it's, like, yes, it was a		
25	big deal.		

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1	And Ohio American Water has been very		
2	approachable from my standpoint. I had a few		
3	business cards in my possession of people whom I can		
4	contact in an instant. They have been out to repair		
5	the lines, and, you know, in proximity to my house		
6	twice in the last probably year and a half and did a		
7	fine job.		
8	So, you know, this isn't the president of		
9	the Timberbrook Homeowners Association coming out		
10	here to yell at you. We want to work with you.		
11	Thank you very much.		
12	THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Thank you.		
13	That was the only person we have signed		
14	up to testify tonight. Is there anyone else who		
15	would like to give testimony?		
16	Because you are an intervenor, you cannot		
17	give testimony here tonight on behalf of your		
18	township. You can testify on your own behalf if you		
19	are a customer, but you cannot give testimony on		
20	behalf of the township.		
21	Would you like to come up and give		
22	testimony?		
23	Please state your name and address.		
24	MR. HEMANN: Andrew Hemann, H-E-M-A-N-N,		
25	810 Formation Court.		

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1		
2	ANDREW HEMANN,	
3	being first duly sworn, as prescribed by law, was	
4	examined and testified as follows:	
5	DIRECT TESTIMONY	
6	MR. HEMANN: I guess with the rate	
7	increase and Ohio American Water knows who I am.	
8	If there's another rate increase after what we went	
9	through, as early as it is when was the last rate	
10	increase? Can you tell me?	
11	THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: I believe it was	
12	2010.	
13	MR. HEMANN: And it happens every year,	
14	and we fought them and fought them and fought them.	
15	I guess why I'm up here right now, I didn't get any	
16	notice of the hearing. When I was a big part in	
17	this, Steve knows, we would put signs up and we would	
18	get crowds. I didn't know the company was being	
19	sold.	
20	In a nutshell, we pay way too much for	
21	water out here, and we have had problems with water	
22	out here as far as hardness. It has gotten better.	
23	But this company, Aqua, is there a	
24	representative here?	
25	Okay, and your name is, sir?	

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1	MR. KOLODZIEJ: Ed Kolodziej.		
2	MR. HEMANN: We do not want more than		
3	just having good water, good water pressure, getting		
4	what we pay for. Like if you go to Kroger's, or		
5	whatever, you get what you pay for.		
6	And we pay a lot. The average around		
7	here, I have a family of seven. I have four out of		
8	the house, now down to one. The average bill is		
9	\$100, \$120 a month, and probably if we wouldn't have		
10	fought as hard as we did over the years, it would		
11	probably be 200.		
12	I'll let you know, Ed, if they start the		
13	same shenanigans as they did in the past, we're going		
14	to fight you. We are not going to put up with it.		
15	It's just ridiculous to pay top money for water,		
16	especially well water. All you do is run a process		
17	and treat the water and put it into our house. I		
18	worked with Columbus water so I know about water.		
19	You said something about approachable		
20	when I walked in. If you could be a better customer		
21	rep for us, it would be much better than Ohio		
22	American Water was because they weren't, and we had		
23	to fight them the whole time from the systems		
24	utilities until now.		
25	I don't have a whole lot to say. I		

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1 didn't prepare anything. I know there is hardship in 2 this community, along with other communities, with taxes and all those other things that go into it, but 3 we shouldn't have to pay the money we're paying for 4 5 water. 6 And I think it's ridiculous that you are 7 even asking for something, especially when you are 8 selling the company. I don't know what this is all 9 about. I had to go online and check PUCO to look at the DIS to see what was going on. 10 11 People can't. There's no voice for us, 12 PUCO doesn't have a voice, and Ohio Consumers' 13 Counsel -- are they here? I guess we will do this again and hopefully get more people at these 14 15 hearings. 16 Did you put an ad in the paper, Northwest 17 News? AUDIENCE MEMBER: It was in the Columbus 18 19 Dispatch. 20 MR. HEMANN: It was in the Dispatch? How 21 big was the notice? You saw it? 2.2 AUDIENCE MEMBER: Yes. That's why I'm 23 here tonight. 24 MR. HEMANN: Are you a customer? 25 AUDIENCE MEMBER: Yes.

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15 MR. HEMANN: Did you tell your neighbors? 1 2 AUDIENCE MEMBER: Yes. 3 MR. HEMANN: That's the biggest thing out here, is that we always kept an eye on stuff. Maybe 4 5 we let our guard down for a year, and here we are 6 again. You guys are coming at us again. 7 That's all I have. I don't have a whole lot. Thank you. 8 9 THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Thank you. 10 Anyone else like to give testimony? 11 Anyone? 12 All right, seeing no one else, I'd like 13 thank everyone for coming this evening. This will 14 conclude this evening's public hearing and it will be submitted on the record for the Commission's 15 16 consideration in this case. 17 Everyone from the Commission and hopefully people from the company and OCC will stick 18 19 around in case there are any questions. Thank you. 20 (The hearing concluded at 6:23 p.m.) 21 2.2 23 24 25
