I have been an AEP Employee for almost 15 years. Prior I had worked for Joint Action Agency, is power supply and power pooling.

I wanted to comment on the issue before the Ohio PUCO concerning moving AEP's generation to competition. AEP has been an Investor Owned Electric Utility, IOU and thus has operated under those rules for regulation, investments, rate of return for a long time. AEP has had a large responsibility, investment and resources to serve many customers, Municipals, Mini's and Rural Electric Coop's over their 100 year history. AEP has had huge undertaking serving so many fairly! There are so many different areas that are critical to the overall well being of all parties involved.

There are three reasons why Investor Owned Electric Utilities, IOUs are in business. First IOUs serve our customers, with the best service possible, with some financial constraints. Secondly IOUs invest in their service territories for the reasons to make a fair rate of return for their investors / share holders. Like any business, AEP is in business to make a profit. Just like any other business, if they do not make a fair return, they go out of business. Municipals, Muni's and Rural Electric Coop's. RECs through the state that basically are customer owned, who invest resources to serve their members. Price for Munis and RECs goal is to serve their customers at any cost. But also on the flip side if Muni and REC can purchase power at a lower cost, their goal is also to try to provide this service as well

Unlike Munis and REC, their total expenses, no matter how large or small, are always covered by their rates. But many Munis and REC do not have the generation necessary to serve their total loads and must purchase power from outside their system. Many times this is the IOUs in the area. There are many Munis and REC who do not even have any generation, and if they do, might only use the generation to peak shave. Thus when Federal and State regulations change, and for example, the air requirements (which are mandated) become more stringent, the IOUs (generators) need to pass through the higher costs for implementing the new requirements.

A customer's ultimate goal is to get the best quality service at the lowest price to produce the best product possible. But as one can see the majority of Munis and RECs choose to purchase power on the open market rather then generate power from with-in. Then thirdly the IOUs also have employees and they also deserve to make a fair wage. These three reasons are why the IOU is in business and is not always very cut and dry, since it is a balancing act between all three IOU's goals.

The utility system is built for that one peak day or peak period. When power is needed on that hottest afternoon in August, the system needs to have the capacity and the system needs to be able to serve that load. If not, we all know the consequences of such poor planning. I might also suggest that if our engineering, planning and all the background details required for those peak hours is not met, I would bet that the problems created, that the customer's affected would be willing to pay much larger fees (double, triple or perhaps even more), than the small rate increases to see that such consequences would not have happened. This is just my guess and is why I would say that IOU typically pro-actively plan ahead, rather then operating in such a reactively (only fixing problems as they arise), or might I say this future competitively mode!

Thus the IOUs goal is build resources through generation, transmission or distribution to serve these customers, which may include the Munis, RECs or even large customers who are

connected to their system. Since IOUs are normally larger than Munis or REC these investments and they are making decisions are for the long term, say for 30+ years, since these investments are very expensive to site, build and run when they are needed.

The Ohio PUCO has the unique position to oversee and in that position they have the responsibility to ensure that all parties receive a fair deal. Basically they are responsible to oversee the PIE. Those customers all share the same resources, when a long term resource such as a new generator is built they need to see that it is justly paid for over the life of the asset and that all the customers who would like to have, share or use that resource, that they pay their fair price for using that resource. The Commissions should not be an adversary, but work as the primary negotiator in coming to a settlement that all parties agree, is a fair agreement. When AEP, the Ohio PUCO and the group of customers all came to an agreement and it was approved by the commission, I though that we were almost there.

In a relatively short period of time to move from a regulated environment to a competitive environment and not recover the investment from those long term (goals) investments would not be in either AEP's, their shareholder's customer's (which those assets were built to supply) best interest? To move to a competitive environment without fairly covering AEP's, our stranded generation costs, would only be in the best interest to all those suppliers / marketers, many who do not even own generation assets, would seem to suggest that AEP needs to recover some stranded costs. Likely how AEP in Texas settled similar differences.

If there are outside parties interested in marketing lower cost power than what has been available prior, something must be wrong with the system! I understand that there has been relatively little new generation built in Ohio and if the costs have all changed, who initiated those changes?

I am hoping for a fair settlement to move AEP's generation from regulated to competition.

The commercial accounts that saw increases in January neglected to dig deeper their bills increased because the seet refund ended at the end of December. This end of a credit plus a rate increase

made the total increase look larger than it was. The bottom line is all of AEP's costs are associated with rising fuel costs and operating costs that have gone up. When fuel prices go up, and the EPA nails AEP to the wall with billions of dollars in upgrades to keep these plants operating 'clean', then clearly those costs need to be paid back by the people that use that electricity (Under the current regulated environment). AEP is simply trying to recover SOME of these costs that have already been spent as it transitions into a deregulated market.
