Thank you for your email regarding Columbia Gas of Ohio's Ackerman Road natural gas pipeline project in northwest Columbus. The Ohio Power Siting Board appreciates your interest in case number 11-3534-GA-BTX.

On March 26, 2011 the Board issued an Opinion, Order and Certificate authorizing Columbia to construct the 1.5-mile long natural gas pipeline along the proposed alternate route from an existing supply point on the south side of Ackerman Road underneath the Olentangy River to a tie-in point on West Tulane Road. The alternate route will not pass underneath The Ohio State University's Wilma H. Schiermeier Olentangy River Wetland Research Park. The Board Certificate is subject to 32 conditions that Columbia must meet to mitigate the social and environmental impacts of the project.

Columbia began construction on the Ackerman Road pipeline earlier this month and anticipates that the project will be completed by Nov. 1, 2012. Once in service, the new 20-inch diameter pipeline will replace an aging 18-inch pipeline and ensure that Columbia can continue to provide safe, reliable service to natural gas customers in northern Columbus.
