AEP states the industry's average 2011 return on equity was a stout 10.25%; while the S&P 500 recorded a lackluster 2%. But for the same period, AEP's total shareholder return was a whopping 20.8%. Accordingly, one can only conclude AEP is revenue rich!

Having initially chased the Enron model, AEP attributes its success to a 2004 "re-dedication" towards a regulated business model, just a few years after Ohio ushered in deregulation. Regardless, AEP's most revealing disclosure has Ohioans making a significant contribution to AEP's Gross Margin, or more specifically, Ohioans are paying far more than their fair share. Now pay close attention to this nugget of information, as it is imperative Ohioans comprehend these comparisons.
