## In the Matter of the Following Joint Application for Integration of Mercantile Customer Energy Efficiency or Peak-Demand Reduction Programs between The Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company and

## The Federal Metal Company (Case No. 11-2219-EL-EEC)

Rule 4901:1-39-05(F), Ohio Administrative Code (O.A.C.), permits a mercantile customer to file, either individually or jointly with an electric utility, an application to commit the customer's existing demand reduction, demand response, and energy efficiency programs for integration with the electric utility's programs. In the above captioned case, the customer and The Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company filed a joint application in accordance with the mercantile application pilot program found in Commission Order 10-834-EL-EEC.

On May 6, 2011 the applicants jointly filed an application requesting an ongoing exemption from the DSE2 rider and provided supporting documentation of the exemption period. Staff reviewed the information and conducted further review of the filing after additional documents where filed on May 24, 2011.

Staff recommends approval of this mercantile commitment application providing The Federal Metal Company an ongoing exemption from the DSE2 rider through April 2013. Additionally, Staff recommends any portion of the DSE2 Rider assessed to the customer during the recommended exemption period be refunded to the customer.
