Thank you for your input regarding the proposed Clinic Substation. I have docketed your letter in the public comments section of the record in case number 11-2754-EL-BSB.

As you know, a local public hearing was held on November 14, 2012 at the Cleveland City Hall to collect testimony from area residents about this project. The adjudicatory proceedings of the case will begin on November 27, 2012 at 10:00 a.m. in the Board's offices in downtown Columbus.

During the adjudicatory proceedings, the applicant, Board staff, and other intervenors will offer expert testimony supporting their positions before an administrative law judge. As in all cases, the topic of site selection will be discussed. As required by law, FirstEnergy submitted two site proposals to the Ohio Power Siting Board (OPSB), a "preferred site" and an "alternate site." The total footprint of the preferred site is 2.8 acres, and the alternate site is 3.4 acres. The OPSB staff has recommended that the Board certificate the preferred site of the project, located at the southeast corner of the intersection of Cedar Avenue and Stokes Boulevard. The Board takes the application, staff's recommendation, and all testimony into consideration of its decision to certificate the facility.
