- Applicant's Exhibit 1. Do you recognize this document?
 - A. Yes, I do.

- Q. Can you tell me what this document is?
- A. It's the application to the Ohio Power Siting Board for a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need for the Knox Transmission Substation Project. It's dated August 2012.
- It was prepared for American Transmission Systems, Incorporated, and it's in case number 12-0864-EL-BSB.
- Q. Which is the case that is the subject of these proceedings?
 - A. Yes, it is.
- Q. And what was your involvement with the preparation of this document?
- A. I led the overall development of the application for American Transmission Systems, Incorporated, and what that means is for this particular application, I developed much of the application and then worked with a consultant, URS Corporation, on some of the technical aspects of the ground selection or sight selection studies.

- Q. And to the best of your information and belief is the information contained in this application true and accurate?
 - A. Yes, it is.

- Q. Okay. Thank you.

- Q. Mr. Krauss, I'm now handing you what's marked for identification purposes as Applicant's Exhibit 2. Do you recognize this document?

 - A. Yes, it does.
- Q. And what is the date of publication of the first notice based on the information in front of you?
 - A. In the Morning Journal it was published

on September 21, 2012.

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Q. And I am now turning the page to mark the date of publication of the first notice in the Minerva News Leader.

Based on the information in front of you, what was the date of publication of that notice?

- A. September 27, 2012.
- Q. And could you tell us what the date of the publication of the second notice for the public hearing was based on the information in front of you?
 - A. It is October 18, 2012.
- Q. And to the best of your knowledge is all the information contained in these documents true and accurate?
 - A. Yes, it is.
 - Q. Thank you.

 - A. Yes, I am.

- Q. In that case I am now handing you what has been marked as Joint Exhibit Number 1. Are you familiar with this document?
- A. Yes, I am. It's the joint stipulation and recommended findings of fact and conclusions of law between American Transmission Systems,
 Incorporated, the Applicant, and the Attorney
 General's office.
 - Q. And are you familiar with the

recommendations and the 18 conditions in the joint stipulation regarding construction of the Knox Transmission Systems substation?

A. Yes, I am.

- Q. Is American Transmission Substation and Transmission Systems, Incorporated as the applicant in these proceedings in agreement with the terms and conditions in the joint stipulation?
 - A. Yes, we are.
- Q. Does the joint stipulation represent a product of serious bargaining among capable knowledgeable parties?
- A. Yes, I believe it was. I was involved as well as members of the Siting Board staff as well as counsel for the parties.
- Q. And does the joint stipulation benefit consumers and the public interest?
- A. Yes, I believe it does because it provides for the proposed projects, the Knox Transmission Substation to be constructed at the preferred site which is what I believe to be the minimal overall impact for this type of project, and it provides for the basic needs of this project to approve the distribution and customer load service from the Knox Transmission Substation or what will

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1 be the Knox Transmission Substation.
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So to the extent that it improves that reliability and service and the stipulation provides for that, yes, I believe it works for the benefit of the customers.

- Q. Thank you. And does the joint stipulation violate any important regulatory principles of practice?
- A. No. I believe that it's in -- it works well with the Ohio Revised Code Section 4906.10 and it was a joint stipulation between the parties.
- Q. And to the best of your knowledge, is all the information contained in that joint stipulation true and accurate?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q. Thank you.
